

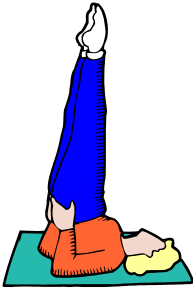

For anyone with a Broadband computer connection, the free "Google Earth" program provides a fascinating way of looking at aerial photos of anywhere in the world - it allows you to zoom in from outer space (like the intro to "Match of the Day") - with the added bonus of being able to change from "top-down" to a sideways view to see what the landscape actually looks like in quasi-3D.

Until very recently, the quality of images for Winster was very poor, but Google have just added new images for this area, which give pretty amazing detail - you can make out individual cars, for example. It would be interesting to work out when the photos were taken - my guess would be about three or four years ago - can anyone come up with a more precise date?

Strangely, the improved aerial images for Winster have not yet been applied to the sister product "Google Maps" (<http://maps.google.co.uk>) - but I would guess that this will catch up quite soon. Google Maps is only 2D, but it a very neat service that offers map-only, satellite-image-only, or an excellent "hybrid" with map details shown over the top of the satellite image.

Under 21? No I.D. = NOSALE

The youth of our village are very important to the future of the community and we recognise that they are a vital part of your shop's survival. The **law on young smokers** comes into effect in **October and those aged 17 will be the hardest hit as the law states that the minimum age rises to 18 to legally purchase tobacco and associated products. However a national campaign also requires shop staff to challenge anyone under 21 for proof of identity. Failure to produce identification will result in lost sales even if you are older than 18.**

This is why I am asking all youngsters over 14 to register with the shop so that we can reduce the embarrassment of conflict when we say NO. It's so easy, all you have to do is bring your **birth certificate** (to be returned), state your **address** and a passport **photo** so that we can log details for the future.

SO SIMPLE—WHY NOT DO TODAY

The shop has a new computerised till system. The old one has increasingly given us problems in recent months which you may have noticed !! We have looked at a number of systems and are confident this one will suit us well. Because of the problems and the changeover we have cut back on our range slightly over the last couple of months. If you have been missing something we normally stock our apologies and if it doesn't come back soon do remind us ! The new system will take a few weeks to bed in with the staff and the customers. For example it does require us to bar code read everything including papers and tokens so there will be some changes for us all to get used to.

Once up and running it will give us much greater stock control and stock usage information as well as management accounting info including VAT reports. It will also be easier for the staff to use, speed up 'check out' service and give itemised receipts. In time we will have all products price marked on the product shelving.

Development Programme.

With an approved grant of £ 20,000 from the Peak Park New Environmental Economy Grant Fund we are ready to begin work on site at the beginning of October. The first phase will involve rebuilding the back area of the shop to provide a new warehouse, staff room and loo, and a preparation kitchen area along with the first floor extension. It is planned this work will be completed in good time for Christmas. Work to the shop itself will take place January to March for which more funding is required !!

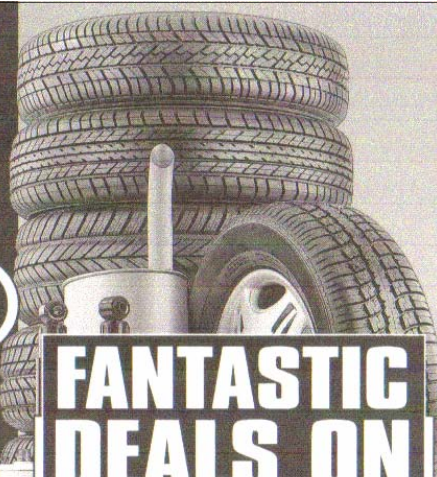

What a summer (not). Buxton independent weather station statistics show that April had just 18mm of rain and June a whopping 163mm (that's nearly six and a half inches of rain, in old money), and at the time of writing July hasn't been much better. But at least here in Winster we've fared better than those poor souls in South Yorkshire, or even closer to home, down in Darley Bridge. There's something to be said for living on top of a hill ... or is there? On the bus down into Matlock on THAT Monday, I was struck by the sheer volume of water pouring off side streets and gardens into drains which just couldn't cope with the deluge: we all love living in our garden and making it into an outdoor room with a patio (I'm guilty) and decking, whilst our love affair with the car means often front gardens are surfaced in tarmac or paving to provide parking. But wait! If we cover all the grass and flowerbeds with "hard" surfaces, what happens when it rains? It's a double whammy: the area available to absorb rainfall is reduced, and the remaining soft ground struggles to absorb not only its own share of water but the runoff from the hard areas. It's the old story, individually what we do might not have much effect, but if a lot of people do something like pave their front gardens the collective result in terms of water pouring down the road can be quite startling. OK, rainfall events like we've had recently are still unusual, but they will continue to happen. So if you're planning some garden changes, think about providing plenty of soft surface to absorb rainfall and don't let it become an SEP (Someone Else's Problem).

Now, something more cheerful. With this issue of the Village Mag is a household energy saving questionnaire provided by the Energy Saving Trust. Please take a few minutes to complete this: we will be coming around to collect them in a week or two. Completed questionnaires will be rewarded with a FREE low-energy lightbulb! All the questionnaires will be sent to Buxton for analysis, and each household will receive a report back on easy steps to take to cut its fuel bills.

Also some good news for those decorating. Have you noticed there's always paint left over in the tin, sometimes quite a lot? The skip lorry, quite rightly, only takes paint tins once the solvents have evaporated to leave a semi-solid congealed mass in the bottom (which can take some time). However the Play and Recycling Centre (PARC) and Community RePaint n Derby takes paint for re-use. Their aim is to take in non-toxic waste products and recycle them for use as play materials, murals etc. They will take USABLE domestic paint in its original container in Gloss, Eggshell, Emulsion, Undercoat, Primer, Masonry, Tile and Exterior paint, also varnishes and woodstains.

No thanks to paint strippers, thinners, brush cleaners, wood preservatives, car paint, aerosols, industrial/specialist paint, cellulose-based paint. Please take your paint to Civic Amenity Site, Raynesway, Derby or to Play & Recycling Centre (PARC), 6-10 Werburgh Street, Derby (phone first to let them know you're coming - 01332 299165). Why not take along your friends' and neighbours' paint too, and if you have a decorator tell him about the project.
