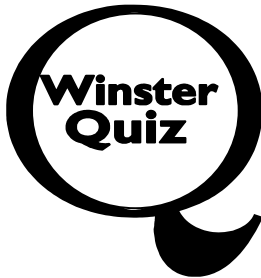

Village Diary—John Geddes

The Village Diary is part of the Winsters Website, and a printed copy goes on the East Bank noticeboard. It's a useful way of making sure that everybody knows about your event, but it is also useful as a way of avoiding clashes between events. If you are organising an event that needs good public support, please make an entry in the Diary so that others can avoid that date when organising their events - if we get two competing events at the same time, neither is likely to do well.

The diary also has value in avoiding clashes between other events, such as committee meetings. Quite a few people in the village belong to several groups or committees, and it is all too easy to end up with people missing from one meeting because the date clashes with a meeting of another group.

Adding a date to the diary is pretty simple - find the diary on the website, then follow the link at the bottom of the page, and fill in the simple form. The details come to me by email; after checking by me (to filter out anything inappropriate), your entry is added to the diary and other groups can avoid clashing with you.

E-mail Hygiene—John Wood

Do you ever get emails where the message is pushed off the screen by the long list of recipients, or where someone has obviously just sent it to everyone in their address book? Do you ever do this? While this can provide a fascinating insight into other people's relationships, it does have some problems.

Firstly, you probably don't have permission to distribute their personal details in this way, so it is a contravention of the data protection laws. We would rightly complain if someone in government distributed our personal information in this way, and we owe it to our friends not to do the same.

Secondly, can you guarantee that every one of those recipients' computers is properly secure, virus free, and will remain so? It only takes one machine to be infected with something nasty like an email harvesting program, and all of those addresses are then made available to spammers or hackers. It's the internet equivalent of having sex with all your friends without protection - if one has an infection, you all get it - and I'm sure you wouldn't do that!

There is an easy solution to this - just put all the senders in the BCC (Blind Carbon Copy) field, instead of the TO or CC field. Each recipient will then only see their own address. BCC is often switched off by default, but if you search your email software help for "BCC" or "Suppress recipient address" you should find out how to do it. In Outlook Express or MS Mail you need to check View > All Headers.

My own rule of thumb is only to put a list of addresses in the TO or CC fields if I know they all already know each others addresses, or if there is good reason why they should know them. And please, before you hit that "send to everyone in my address book" button, just ask yourself if they really all want to receive that particular chain letter. A little discretion rarely goes amiss.

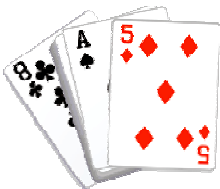
Free Tables at Market House Clear Out, Saturday 29 March

Green Corner—Jo Ferguson

Green Run

What wonderful, wonderful frosty blue mornings and fantastic sunsets this month. It'll be a few weeks yet till the heating can be switched off, and I was recently reminded of the value of a Green Run. For those of you ski-ing fans, you might think this is something to do with hurtling down snowy slopes with a couple of long sticks attached to your feet, but the Green Run also means the walk round your house at night to make sure you are making the most of your heating and lighting. Points to check:

Are curtains/blinds closed at dusk/ (a lot of heat is lost through your windows)
Internal doors closed to keep heat where YOU want it
Thermostatic radiator valves controlling individual room temperatures (does the spare bedroom REALLY need to be that warm?)
Draught excluders (sausage dogs) blocking draughts under doors
Lights turned off when you leave the room

Go on, make it part of YOUR routine!

E Day

On the same theme, did you know that 27 February is E-day? From 6pm on 27 February the nation is asked to switch off electrical items not in use, for 24 hours. The idea is that the National Grid will assess what difference it makes to electricity consumption, measure consumption during the 24 hours against a "business as usual" forecast, and report back what savings have been achieved across the whole country. Although realistically they expect a drop in usage of 1-3%, there are other benefits too - Check out this article for more information <http://news.bbc.co.uk/1/hi/sci/tech/7209817.stm>. Suggestions for what you could try doing: making sure all electrical kit not in use is switched off at the plug, turning off the TV if you're not actually watching it, and filling the electric kettle with only the amount of water you **need**.

Plastic

Now, some great news on the plastic film recycling front. Sainsbury's in Matlock invite shoppers to put their plastic into hoppers at aisle ends for recycling. They have now agreed to take ALL of Winster's plastic film for recycling, baling and sending back to their depot for recycling. I am very grateful to the Manager, Richard Moore, for this as it means I can now reclaim my spare bedroom which was piled high with boxes. and Lesley Lax's car can heave a sigh of

relief as it won't now have to be laden with plastic on its trips to Norwich! So please carry on putting plastic into the bin beside the shop and we'll take it down for you. What could be easier? Don't forget that bubble wrap counts as plastic film so can be recycled.

Getting ready in the garden

With spring on the way, now is the time to start thinking about whether to buy new plants for your garden so find out which species are local.
