WINSTER WASPS FOOTBALL CLUB

Results: The team has played a number of friendly matches over the summer in preparation for the new season. Some of the results include a 3-1 defeat at Poulterton, a 5-5 draw with Brampton Red Lion, where we came back from 5-1 down and a 6-3 defeat at home to local rivals Elton. Whilst these do not look the best results on paper, all the matches were against teams in higher divisions (Elton are in division 4) that have been playing together for much longer.

14/9/2008 Blue Bell Bolsover 4 – 0 Winster Wasps. With our first match being called off due to a waterlogged pitch, our first game of the season was away at Bolsover. With a much depleted squad we began the match on the back foot with Bolsover enjoying the majority of possession. The first chance of note came midway through the first half when a fierce shot from outside the area was deftly turned over the bar by the Winster keeper. The first goal came after poor marking allowed the Bolsover man too much room in the box to slot into the bottom corner. After the goal Winster began to get more of the play, until a late goal sent us in at half time 2 down. The second half saw the Wasps get more possession, with a well struck free kick from 35yards out forcing the Bolsover keeper into a smart save to push the ball onto the bar. Shortly afterwards Bolsover got a third with an unstoppable shot from the edge of the area. Winster pressed for a consolation, but this allowed Bolsover to play on the break, with a forth goal coming after their forward rounded the keeper and was able to pass the ball into the net. And so our first match finished in a loss, although with a stronger team the result would have been very different. *Man of the Match: Jimmy Millett. (I didn't want to put myself as man of the match, but the manager, chairman and club secretary told me I had to!)*

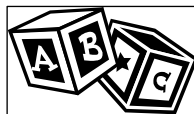
