Changes to 172 Bus Timetable from 30th March

There are some substantial changes to the 172 Bus Service from 30th March. We lose Bank Holiday buses (they still run on Easter Monday and May Day, but not after that) – but there are two extra buses a day to and from Matlock. Some Bakewell timings change, but the number of buses is unchanged. Saturday timings will change so that they are more similar to weekday timings.

The last bus towards Matlock, at 2303, will now carry passengers all the way into Matlock (it used to throw them off at Darley Dale).

Four buses from Matlock have been retimed so that you have a chance of connecting from a train. But three of these offer a one-minute connection and are unlikely to wait: the new "bus/rail interchange" has been designed so that bus drivers can't tell whether the train has arrived or not. The best chance of a good connection is if you catch the 1750 train from Derby

– there is a four minute connection at Matlock, and if all goes well, the Derby-Winster trip takes under an hour. But if the train is more than four minutes late, the next bus is nearly five hours later.

The Saturday Morning "Skip Lorry" is a fantastic facility - especially for the fact that it stops at four different places in the village.

But it can be really tough for the driver to find somewhere safe to stop - especially at the Market House and on West Bank. And if cars are parked unfortunately, it can be very difficult to get the vehicle up East Bank. The driver who came in February was a real trooper, who managed to keep going despite some very tricky manoeuvring - but there is a real risk that one day we hit a driver who complains, or find that some Health & Safety person decides that some of the Winster stops are too tricky.

To reduce such a risk, it would be really helpful if those parking near the stopping points could leave suitable spaces for the lorry to park and turn on those six or so Saturday mornings a year. The list of dates is on the village noticeboard and in the Winster Diary on the website.

Visit to Winster Church, Churchyard and Tower Monday 27 April

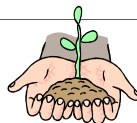
