## Winster Village Shop

Thank you to everyone who completed the customer survey forms in June. We came 3rd in the Derbyshire Rural Retailer of the Year competition and won a prize of £500.

The other good news is that we have been awarded a £ 10,000 grant through the Rural Development Programme for England in order to help us carry out Phase 2 of our redevelopment programme. This work links the new services area to the shop providing additional retail space so we can incorporate the Post Office. It also separates the shop from the upper floors and provides an external access to upstairs so this can be redeveloped for residential use. The plan is to do the building work in Oct / Nov and relocate the Post Office in the New Year.

In the meantime we have installed a new upright freezer ( not without some difficulty ) and taken out one of the old chest freezers which has been replaced with additional island shelving. It involved a fair bit of moving around of other shelving and product groups which seems to have worked well. A big thank you to the team who got everything done one Wednesday afternoon in June.

Recent new product introductions include a range of own label cakes and biscuits branded 'Winster Village Shop'. Please try them out and let us know what you think of them. The Dundee Cake is already proving very popular. With the new service area fully in use we want to start making our own filled rolls. If you would like to help us with this project and give us a couple of hours Tuesdays / Saturday mornings do let us know. A team of 3 or 4 helpers would share the work and allow each member to help us as and when they can.

It is good to see so much building work still going on in Winster. The workmen involved are very good customers for pies, soft drinks etc. However do please ask them not to park their vans all day outside the shop, that really kills trade.

Sales are nicely up so far this year so thank you for your support. We will keep you informed on the programme for Phase 2 and it is possible we might get some more grant money later this year to help us finish the whole programme. That would be good.

## So Where's the New Shop Awning?

Those of you who took part in the April fund-raising Auction of Promises at the BI, in aid of Winster Village School and Winster Village Shop, especially those who donated "promises", might be forgiven for wondering what happened to the awning that was intended to protect the shop window from the glare of the hot summer sun that we have experienced in recent weeks.

Unfortunately, it is bogged down in that labyrinthine process known as "planning approval". One might also be forgiven for thinking that a shop awning of the type that was fitted to Winster Village Shop in days gone by would not require much in the way of "planning approval". Not so. We are not quite in the same league as an extra runway at Heathrow, but in terms of documentation, a new awning for Winster Village Shop requires about twice as much paperwork as it does for a new house-building project. As a Listed Building, it needs two, almost identical, but separate planning applications, each requiring the equivalent of about 40 sheets of A4. But each set of applications has to be duplicated four times, so that's 320 sheets of A4, equivalent to about double the area of the awning. It includes a declaration (in quadruplicate) that no bats or great crested newts will be harmed in the process!

This is not intended as a "Knock Peak Park" exercise. The planning authority has to act in accordance with the laws of the land, no matter how daft they may be. The PPA officers have been extremely helpful, and even they seem bewildered by the complexity of the process and the superabundance of chopped down forest that is required.

So don't hold your breath. With a bit of luck, the new awning might be in place in time to keep the snow off the shop front, but don't bank on it!

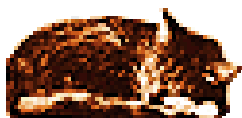

East Midlands Trains are expected to run two special-offer days this summer.

A one-day ticket costing £10 per adult (£5 per child) will allow unlimited travel anywhere on their network (which goes to London, Liverpool, Cleethorpes, Skegness and Norwich). But you will only be able to buy the tickets at a particular station, for travel on that specific day.

The first of the days is Thursday 30th July when the special tickets will be available at Chesterfield station only, from 0900. 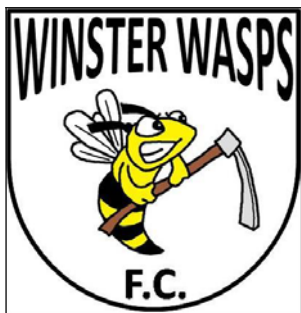

Hello there at Winster Mag.

I am putting feelers out with hope of tracing my true identity. Without repeating myself, the forward emails below will explain the story so far. I am hoping that one of your readers will help track down the real me! If you can help in any way I will be extremely grateful.

In 1920/5 my Grandfather, Francis Carver moved from Derbyshire to Scunthorpe and took a job at the local steelworks before buying a fish and chips shop. A clue as to where he came from in Derbyshire is a plaque on the front wall of a house he had built...'WINSTER'. Granddad died in 1950 at the age of fifty.

Then in the mid fifties my father, Eric Samuel Carver took me and the rest of the family to Ripley, I recall him visiting an old friend a few doors away from a pub named, 'The Pick & Shovel'. Then after my father died in 1980, I was informed by my mother that Dad was born in a place called Belper shortly before the family moved to Scunthorpe.

She also informed me that Carver was not his original name, as his father (Granddad Carver) adopted his Aunts married name of Carver, after being thrown out of the Lilley/Lilly household for being drunk.

As you will no doubt agree, it would appear that I am a lost soul! I do hope you will consider my plea for help that I may at long last discover my real self.
