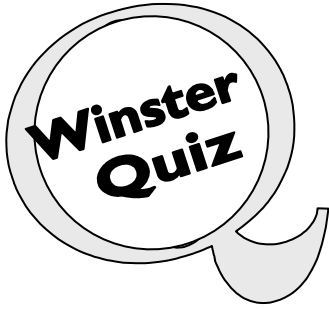

From Ore to Orchids

An evening of film by Niki & Mat Adlam-Stiles
Monday 26th April at 7:30pm in the Burton Institute

Many of us can picture the Peak District landscape as it is today – a diverse landscape of outstanding natural beauty scattered with picturesque villages and quiet hamlets – but what do we really know of its hidden side?

Since mediaeval times, mankind has left an indelible mark on the landscape, shaping it, working it, tending it – and continues to do so today. Written, filmed and produced by Mat & Niki Adlam-Stiles, "From Ore to Orchids" explores some of the unlikely and sometimes uncomfortable inter-relationships between man, industry and nature. A film designed to raise more questions than it answers, "From Ore to Orchids" highlights the unexpected and almost symbiotic relationships that have developed over time, through history, and into the future that we all have the opportunity to influence. Complemented by "Treasures of the Earth" an earlier short film that takes a look at both the archaeological interest and natural beauty to be found underneath England's hillsides.

Vote for Winster's most famous resident

Derbyshire County Council is offering to put up six blue plaques to commemorate famous local people. Winster's nomination has won through to the short list of twelve and people now are invited to vote. Our nominee is Llewellynn Jewitt, who lived in Winster Hall 1867-1880 and is buried in the churchyard with members of his family.

It was Jewitt who brought the first piped water to Winster. He did all the raising of money, getting permission from the landowners and organising the local labour. In 1871 there was a grand opening of eight public taps around Winster, several of which can still be seen. This water-supply scheme lasted, with modifications, until 1937. Jewitt loved Winster and the villagers seem to have loved him. He was specially enthusiastic about our village traditions, and always welcomed the Guisers at the Hall.

His public-spiritedness was felt throughout the county. He founded the Derby Telegraph, ran the Derby Museum, and helped found the Derbyshire Archaeological Society. Nationally, too, he was famous as an illustrator, engraver, lithographer, publisher and author. His output was staggering, and his biographer tells how he often worked late into the night at Winster Hall to complete a commission so that he could send it off by rail the next morning.

The full list of candidates for blue plaques is in the March issue of *Derbyshire First*, the Council's free newspaper. Please vote (individually) for Jewitt, using either the postal voting form in the paper or online at www.derbyshire.gov.uk/blueplaques. Thank you.

Low-cost mobile networks for Winster

If you don't use your mobile a vast amount, a low-cost Pay-As-You-Go deal could be a good bet.

Whilst many cheap operators use the T-mobile network (which seems to have particularly poor coverage in Winster), there are now two operators offering 8p/min and 4p/text using the O2 network (Tesco Lite and GiffGaff) and one (Asda) offering the same prices using the Vodafone network.

GiffGaff has the extra benefit of free mobile calls and texts between their customers if you spend at least £10 every three months. But as a down-side, you can only top up online, where Tesco and Asda allow you to top up in shops (including Winster Village Shop).
