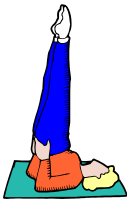

Grants made to Winster organizations from Secret Gardens 2010.

Thanks to the hard work of everyone involved, Secret Gardens 2010 is able to give £2,000 to village groups and organizations. Everyone who applied this year provided all the information we asked and as each application asked for money for a specific purpose and grants have been made on the understanding that the money is used for that purpose.

- Darby and Joan Club: £250 to pay for hire of the Community Bus for outings.

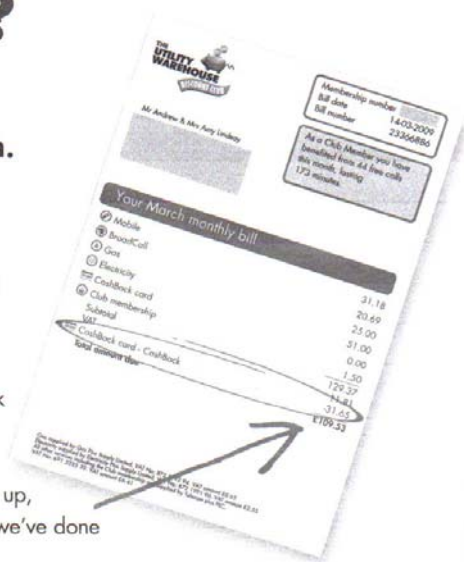

Digital Changeover

August 2011 will see Winster's ordinary ("analogue") TV signal turned off - ordinary TVs will no longer pick up any channels at all. Satellite services are unaffected, but households may still have extra TVs that aren't hooked up to the satellite system. Recent TV's may have a Freeview decoder built in, but older TV's will each need a separate Freeview box (from about £20) to convert the new digital signal. The new signal will come from the same transmitter masts, but may be less tolerant of a poor or misaligned aerial or dodgy aerial cables.

The most unwelcome impact will be on those using a video recorder, as you have to set the recorder to record at the given time, then you have to set the Freeview box to show the right channel at that time. The good news is that Freeview boxes with built-in recorders are available from around £100, which are easier than the traditional video: you choose from a list on the screen.

The changeover will take place in two stages during August 2011. There will be more information (including details of the help scheme for over-75's and some disabled people) delivered to homes nearer the time.

Which aerial are you using

When the changeover is complete, Stanton Moor and Darley Dale transmitters will provide 18 TV channels: more than now, but a long way short of the "full" 53-channel Freeview package that is available to those in urban areas. Ordinary Freeview boxes here will receive BBC1, BBC2, BBC3, BBC4, ITV1, ITV2, ITV2+1, Channel4, Channel4+1, Five, More4, E4, cbbc, cBeebies, BBCNews, BBCParliament, plus "chat" channels Rabbit and Gay Rabbit. Those with Freeview+ and High-Definition TVs will also get three HD channels: BBCHD, ITV1HD and 4HD.

Belmont Transmitter will offer 36 channels (the same 18, plus extras including ITV3, FiveUSA and Fiver, along with the monthly-fee Topup TV), but still not the full Freeview portfolio.

Which transmitter is your aerial using? Have a look at it: if the bars run horizontally and it is pointing towards Wensley, that is Belmont. If the bars run vertically, then it will be Stanton Moor or Darley Dale, depending on which direction it is pointed in.

If you want more channels (including Film4, ITV4, for example), satellite will be your only option. There are two FreeSat options (one from Sky, one from the Freesat consortium) which offer a reasonable range of channels for a one-off fee of around £150 for Standard Definition - without any ongoing payments.
