Between midday on Tuesday 2nd July and 7.55am on Wednesday 3rd July, a '05 registered green coloured Suzuki quad bike was stolen from farm premises in the Islington Lane / Buckdale Lane area of Elton. The non-emergency number is a 24/7 service which should be used for all police matters of a non-urgent nature. These include:

- If you want to give police information about a crime in the area.
- If you want to contact a local police officer (such as someone from your Safer Neighbourhood Team).
- If your property has been stolen or damaged and it is not a crime in progress.
- If you suspect drug use and dealing in your area.

If you want to report a minor traffic collision.

Always ring 999 in an emergency. An emergency is where there is a crime in progress, or an immediate threat to life or property.

## Winster Pond Update

I was at the pond recently and it was alive with dragon and damselflies. I saw 3 Broad Bodied Chasers, 2 Males and 1 female which was ovipositing. There was also a female Common Hawker ovipositing at the waters edge. This is a striking dragonfly with bright yellow/orange leading edges to its wings. There were numerous breeding pairs of common blue damselfly and Large Red Damselfly as well. I have sent a record of these to the British Dragonfly Society BDS. These sightings are a really good sign of improving habitat and a great reward for all the effort put in to date by various people. I noticed most of the plants have survived and established really well but the Elodea and curly pondweed have spread rapidly since we removed the Typha. We will have to consider getting these under control over the next couple of years as part of the ongoing management plan.

I have started discussions with Sharon Slack Headteacher at the school regarding involving the children in the design of an interpretation board. This should tie in nicely with the Eco Schools scheme and Green Flag awards that the school are involved in.

We are moving forward with the community orchard project and with the help of our new team member Sally Smith, we have agreed a suitable species list. We have more work to do around the orchard project but we should be on target for planting this coming season.

## **Winster Shop Notice Board**

Each card will cost £0.50p and can be displayed for maximum of 4 weeks at £1.00 - so the total cost would be £1.50 for 4 weeks.
