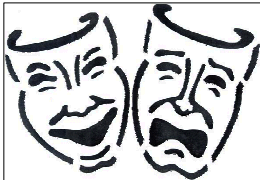

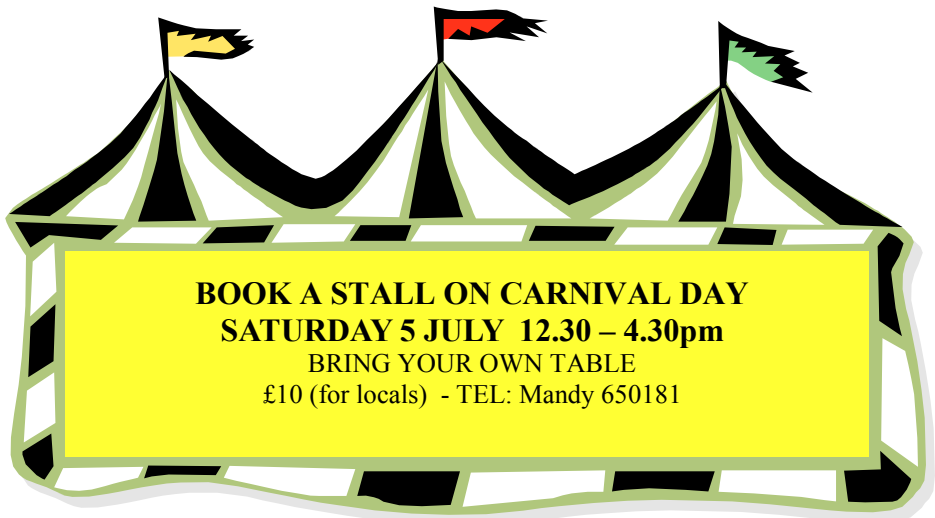

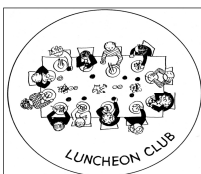

Planning trips by Public Transport

There are several online services that let you plan end-to-end public transport journeys. Google Maps (which now claims to have journey times for the whole of the UK) is very easy to use, but not very well known. If you Google something like "Winster to Sheffield" and take the Maps option, the default is for the system to plan a car journey (and it does that rather well: try pulling the recommending route around). But if you click the Bus icon, it will plan the journey using public transport (including major ferries if you are that ambitious) and show you the route on the map and the timings on a rather helpful Gantt chart.

Just be aware that watching You: if you use them to search for journeys to Six Mile Bottom (Cambridgeshire), don't be surprised if you suddenly start seeing lots of slimming ads.

Local heating and plumbing firm offers free CO detectors in support of national campaign

PEAK DISTRICT plumbing and heating firm, Fired Up Heating Services, is joining the national chorus on carbon monoxide safety and encouraging Peak District residents to make their homes safe. Fired Up Heating Services will be supporting the annual [Wise Up to CO campaign](#), by fitting free CO detectors for local residents when installing a new boiler. The company's owner, David Gilling, is promoting the Plumb and Parts Centre call to raise awareness of the risks of CO poisoning and how it can be avoided.

He said: "Carbon monoxide poisoning poses a real danger to those who become affected, and spotting the symptoms are almost impossible as CO is something you cannot taste, see or smell. But by installing an audible CO alarm and having regular servicing and checks conducted by a Gas Safe Engineer on your home's gas appliances, risks can be significantly reduced and avoided. It is critical that government acknowledges these risks, and as in Scotland and Northern Ireland, moves to make the fitting of CO alarms with all new and replacement boilers compulsory"

According to the Health and Safety Executive (HSE), around 50 people die from accidental CO poisoning in England and Wales each year, with around 4,000 admitted to hospital with symptoms.

On June 26th 1945 many nations of the world signed the United Nations Charter. The charter is a statement of values and goals for all the member states of the UN.
