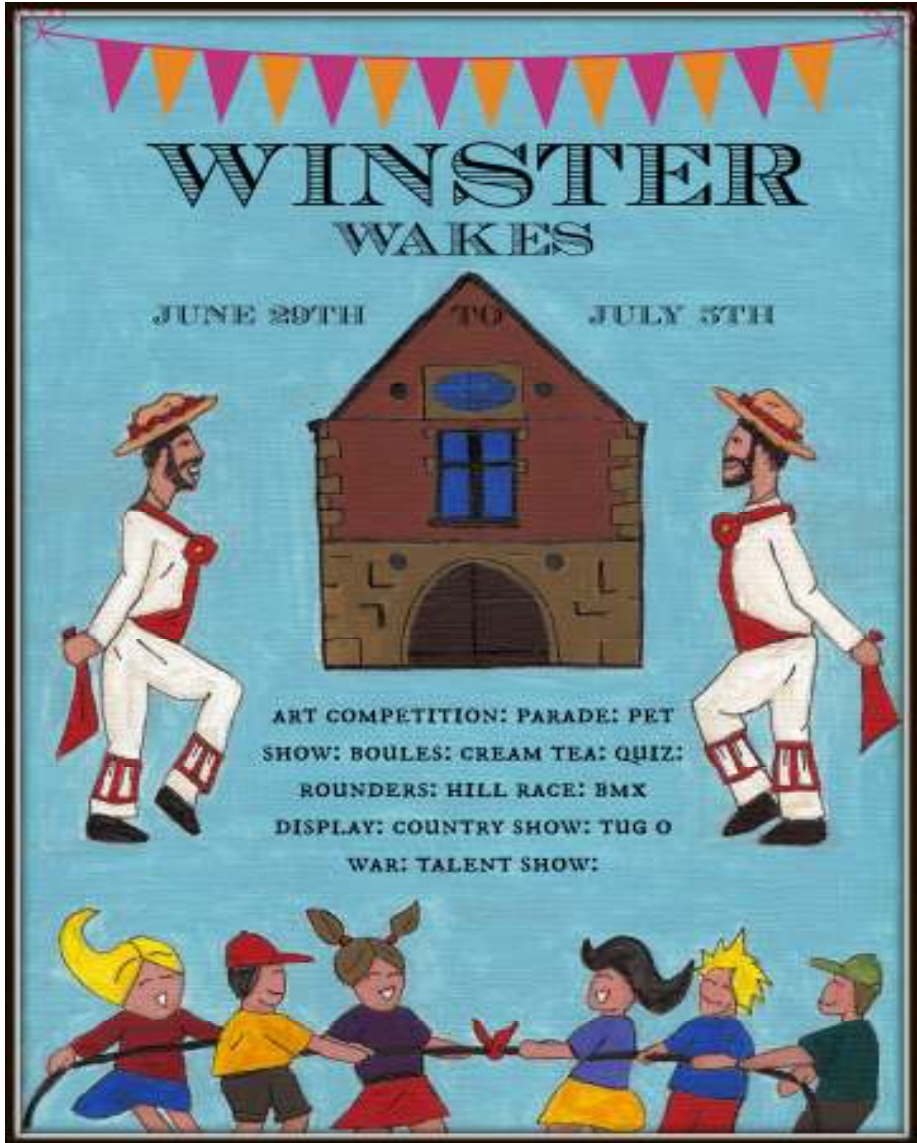

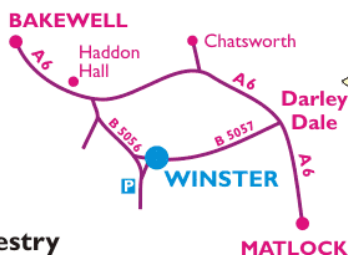

COMEDY AND MUSIC NIGHT: 'EY UP MI DUCK!'

The stage show of the best selling book *Ey Up Mi Duck!* comes to Winster Wakes on Wednesday 2 July for a one-off special performance. 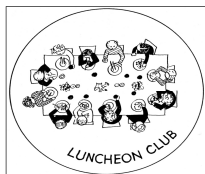
We made 'the charge' old comrade, down the ramp and up the beach,

Griffe Grange Wind Farm

Lexcomm gave a presentation to Winster Parish council on the proposed wind farm and in particular details of the community fund. The fund will be based on an annual contribution made by the owner of the wind farm throughout the 25 year lifetime of the wind farm. Over 25 years, local people will see approximately £1.56 million invested in community groups and projects. The fund can be invested in facilities such as community centres, travelling cinemas, local mini-buses and subsidised broadband.

Although there is no photo montage of how the turbines would look from the B5056 going down into Grangemill there is one from Bonsall Moor. The planning application is open for comments until early July and can be seen on line at

Vicar's Letter for June

Catch a World Cup football match on your own isn't like watching it in the pub or even better watching it live in the stadium or as we have in Matlock an Arena!! The same is true when we consider what it is to be a Worshiping Christian. I hear it often, "I don't have to go to church to be a Christian". That may or may not be true but, from my point of view, it seems almost impossible to be a Christian in isolation. Imagine you were completely alone in the pub watching the cup final, England are winning four nil against Germany with two minutes to go. There is no atmosphere, no sense of community, no support and no companionship when one celebrates or commiserates. Jesus was very astute when he said, "where two or three are present there am I in the midst". A Christian is a social being, we need to worship together, we need to celebrate together, laugh and cry together. So In our United Benefice we need to work hard at being a real, open, welcoming family. Being a church family is also about generosity, not asking the worldly question, "what can I get out of this relationship"? But asking the Gospel questions, "what can I offer to build up this community or what can I do to help other people come to know about God?"
