Why Winster needs a Green Cabinet

New Readers Start Here: Elton gets its phone lines from Winster exchange, and yet they are going to get "Superfast" Broadband pretty soon, many months before Winster. I have been seeking a sensible explanation, and have at last found one.

Superfast Broadband sends stronger signals down the phone lines than at present, and if those stronger signals originated at the exchange, they would cause interference between the pairs of wires serving different customers as they all leave the building in one tightly-packed bundle.

By installing a green cabinet outside the exchange in Winster, Openreach can separate the cables that run to various parts of the village (and beyond) and so reduce the interference to acceptable levels. So, much of Winster will have to wait until a cabinet is installed before we can

have the faster service, while service will start sooner for those areas that have cabinets already in place, such as Elton (and perhaps bits of the western end of Winster). But note that having a cabinet is no guarantee: if a cabinet has few lines on it, Openreach may decide not to offer

Superfast Broadband on it at all - you won't know for sure whether you can have Superfast Broadband until Internet Service Providers start taking orders for the service.

Derbyshire Record Office to host Winster exhibition!

From the 5th May – 1st June, the Derbyshire Record Office in Matlock will be showcasing an exhibition themed around Winster and Elton. On display in the reception will be a selection of the handmade books made by members of the Winster and Elton Luncheon Club last year. The books tell the story of the life of their maker and were made for a Junction Arts project called My Wonderful Life.

Also included in the exhibition will be examples of Winster Wakes posters and some drawings made by the Luncheon Club from a previous project they took part in called Memory Lane. There will also be a rare opportunity to see some original documents from the Record Office archive that relate to both villages.

For those that pay their Council Tax Monthly. The Default setting is that you pay for the year in 10 months. Since 2013 you have the right to pay over 12 months. You still pay the same amount but the monthly figure is reduced .e.g. If your council tax bill is £2400 that would be £240 over 10 months, if you ask to pay over 12 months that figure is £200 per month.

The Derbyshire Federation for Mental Health a locally based Mental Health Charity has secured funding from Lloyds Bank Foundation and Comic Relief to fund a Telephone Support Service for individuals living with mild/moderate mental health conditions.

The service began in April 2014 and provides the opportunity to access support via a weekly phone call (for up to 12 weeks) from a trained mental health support worker. This service offers support to individuals who due to the lower threshold of their mental ill health are often unable to access statutory and other services.

During the telephone support individuals can for example be supported to address their feelings of loneliness and social isolation. They are encouraged to talk over their issues and anxieties and are supported to develop strategies and coping mechanisms. In addition individuals may be sign-posted to other organisations and agencies where appropriate. Referrals can be made by health professionals or by self-referral. Frank knows every detail of the classic gritstone quarry at Bolehill, Grindleford, and will take us through its geology, working and output, from gateposts, troughs and millstones to the thousands of tons of stone it provided for the building of the Howden and Derwent reservoir dams, from where to this day Winster (along with Nottingham and Leicester) gets its drinking water.

We plan to arrange a follow-up guided walk round the quarry at which Frank will show us its many fascinating details, including about 200 abandoned millstones, standing neatly on end, waiting for buyers who never came.
