At last - a reason for visiting Burton on Trent

Train travel at short notice can cost a lot: the cheapest Matlock-London single booked on the day costs £66.50 because East Midlands Trains stop selling cheaper fixed-train tickets the night before. But not all train companies are that mean. You can book cheap on-the-day tickets from Burton-on-Trent to London (Euston) online from £27.50, then add a ticket from Matlock to Burton for an extra £8.80 and pick up both tickets at Matlock. As with all split-ticket journeys, you need catch a train that stops at the station where your tickets join (in this case, Burton) but you don't need to get off, and the diversion adds just 50 minutes to the journey time.

As for all rail journeys, avoid booking via Trainline - who add extra fees even for collecting your tickets from a station ticket machine. The East Midlands Trains website will sell you tickets for anywhere in the UK (even tickets specific to other train companies) without extra fees.

Fired Up Heating Services supports Gas Safety Week: 14 – 20 September 2015

Gas Safety Week is an annual week coordinated by the Gas Safe Register to raise awareness of gas safety and the importance of taking care of your gas appliances.

Having pledged my support again this year I wanted to help raise awareness in Winster. So here are some top tips for staying safe in your home:

- Always use a **Gas Safe registered engineer** to install, fix and service gas appliances, and ensure gas appliances are safety checked each year.
- **Check gas appliances** for warning signs that they are not working properly i.e. lazy yellow flames instead of crisp blue ones, black marks or stains around the appliance and too much condensation in the room.
- Always ensure there is **enough ventilation** and that vents providing gas appliances with an air supply are not blocked.
- Recognise the **signs of carbon monoxide poisoning**: headaches, dizziness, nausea, breathlessness, collapse and loss of consciousness.
- Buy an **audible carbon monoxide alarm** for your home and make sure it is located near to gas appliances, in accordance with the manufacturer's guidance.

And don't forget ... always ask to see your engineer's **Gas Safe Register ID** card to ensure they are properly qualified.

If you are concerned about any of your gas appliances or would like them safety checked call David Gilling at Fired Up Heating Services (see opposite) or any other Gas Safe registered engineer for more advice on gas safety .

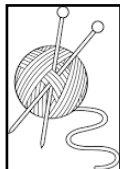

In our busy and technological age what can this young mother from Palestine teach us? First Mary was Faithful; she was asked by an angel to bear the Son of God. She was asked to cope with the disgrace and the pain which a single mother would have to face in that time and that place. But she said 'yes' - we are called to say yes to what God is calling each one of us to do. God has a 'job' only you can do; and he invites you to take on different roles. The next quality she has is humility - humility is simply being ourselves (with all our sins and brokenness) before God. We replace God with ourselves; we think that we are in charge and that we run the show. So humility calls us to value ourselves as a beloved child of God. It calls us to lean on the Lord in our weakness and pain. Think of Romans Eight - 'All things can be used for good in your lives by God' Nothing irredeemable will happen to us. God can enter every part of our broken lives. Mary is ecumenical. This poor, simple, fearful Jewish girl is respected by Muslims, Christians and some Jews. Mary is a bridge builder, she helps other people who share her simple humanity build a bridge through her example to her beloved Son.
