I recently met someone from the Operation Christmas Child depot in Chesterfield who told me some amazing stories about the boxes. For example, on a very hot day in a Central African country, those watching a lad opening a box gasped with horror as he unpacked a pair of ski gloves! Incredibly, the boy was delighted and shouted 'God has answered my prayer!' He had to help his grandmother in her bakery and kept burning his hands on the oven so the gloves would provide protection (I don't suggest we all get ski gloves!!).

Road Closure Notice - West End, Elton

West End, Elton will be closed between 28 September 2015 and 23 October 2015.

The road was closed a couple of months ago to allow Severn Trent to carry out works to renew the water main. The works were not completed due to complications and the road will have to be closed again to allow them to come back and finish the job. The notice states that the precise location of the closure will be 35 metres west of the junction with Well Street for a distance of 120 metres in a westerly direction (towards Gratton). Last time the road closure took place, access was maintained for the vast majority of the time and it is hoped that this will be the case again. Access, however, cannot be guaranteed all of the time.

The road will re-open as soon as the work is finished. This may be earlier than advertised.

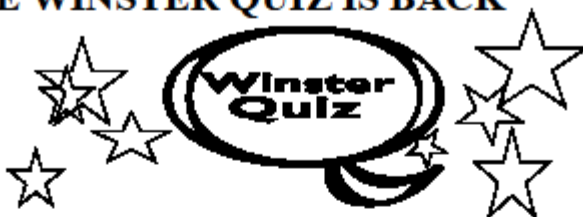

Could you look behind closed doors?

We are currently looking for new volunteers to join the Independent Monitoring Board (IMB) to help ensure that proper standards of care and decency are maintained. The IMB monitors the day to day life of those being detained in prison and ensures that all relevant rules and conditions are complied with. IMB members visit the establishment on a regular basis, usually unannounced. They monitor all areas, talk to prisoners and staff and ensure all are treated with decency and humanity. They listen to complaints and requests from prisoners confidentially and advise and refer issues when support is required. The work of the IMB member is valuable, interesting and important requiring both an objective and caring approach.

Board members are volunteers, appointed by the Ministry of Justice. The Board is independent of the prison and ideally reflects a cross section of the local community from all walks of life and experience. No special qualifications are required, just commitment, enthusiasm, and time, usually 4 half days a month. The Board works as a team and full training is seen as a priority. As a voluntary role there is no formal payment, however travelling expenses and in some circumstances some loss of earnings are paid. Foston Hall prison is a female establishment situated at Foston village on the A50 and is looking for volunteers to join the Board and contribute to this challenging role and develop new and existing skills.

Transport for the Community by the Community

Would you like to become a volunteer for Bakewell and Eyam Community Transport (BECT)? BECT provides accessible transport for rural communities across Derbyshire Dales and the Peak District. Last year 3264 passenger car journeys were provided for people living in local communities. Volunteers help individuals who struggle to use conventional transport, perhaps disadvantaged because of age or disability or simply because no local scheduled services exist. All you need to help is a little spare time, access to a car and have held a full driving licence for at least two years. There is no need to make a regular commitment, you can help with as little as one journey per month or as much as five per week; the choice is yours and is totally flexible.

The rewards of volunteering for the community car scheme are many and include the chance to give something back to your community and help people live more independent lives, the opportunity to make new friends and participate in social events, and the chance to learn new skills.

We need more volunteer car drivers to help us to continue to provide this much valued service.

Councillor's Corner

As you might be aware Derbyshire County Council have been consulting members of the public on the future of the Community Transport Service. This service is a life-line to many residents, groups and organisations who rely on it for weekly trips out to the shops, hospital appointments and GP surgeries. More importantly the Community Transport Service provides a form of travel for those people with restricted mobility who can find regular buses difficult to use. Due to budget cuts and increasing demands on other services the County Council are proposing to make savings by reducing the number of shopping buses to one a week. They are also planning to withdraw all funding for the aCTive Travel scheme which helps to hospitals and other healthcare appointments and could leave many vulnerable people left to suffer in silence.

At the next meeting of the District Council on Thursday 24 September I will be putting forward a motion that will ask members to oppose these measures. If passed, the motion will result in the District Council writing to the Leader of the county Council asking her to rethink the proposals which will have a detrimental impact on the health and wellbeing of many people across the Derbyshire Dales. I will report back next month on the outcome of the motion. I would also like to thank everybody who has contacted me about this important issue.
