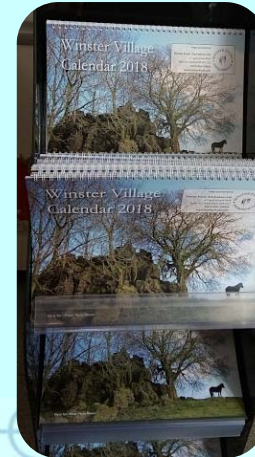

“Use it or lose it... The shop only survives with the support of the local community and the goodwill of the people who have invested in it.

The shop is very well managed. Jayne and Katrina have succeeded in increasing profit margins to a positive level this year. However, we have noticed a recent drop in sales. Based on discussions with shop staff and general observations, it is apparent that a high number of residents in Winster and surrounding villages do not use the shop at all (possibly through a preference for online shopping) or only use the shop as a source for newspapers.

The main challenge of the business at present is cash flow. The shop needs regular cash input to sustain its activities. That cash can only come from customers. And the core of the customers are the residents of Winster and the surrounding villages.

For a small enterprise, Winster shop has a fantastic range of foods and goods on sale, much of it locally sourced. The shop management have ongoing plans to further improve this range.

We would ask residents to consider and answer the following questions when planning their shopping expenditure:-

- Can I buy what I need from the village shop before I purchase from my current source?
- Do I want to keep the facility of having a shop in the village?

If the answer is yes to both of the above, then we would ask for you to begin buying from your community shop to reverse the sales trend. If every household not buying from the shop spent a minimum of £5.00 per week, there would be an immediate positive impact to our cash flow.

Our shop is a major asset to the village. It is one of the reasons why people choose to live and holiday here. The board will do all it can to maintain the sustainability of the shop for the long term - but the support of the whole community is also needed

We propose to discuss the findings of the forthcoming shop survey and the above points in more detail at the **AGM on the 29th November at the Burton Institute.**

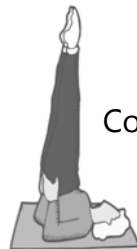

Tales of old Winster-with Eric Shimwell

This tale was told by Eric Shimwell, who lived for most of his 78 years in Winster. He is fondly remembered as a village character and his recollections were transcribed by one time village postmaster Paul Downing. His tales are reprinted here with Paul Downing's kind permission.

Fish 'n Chips at Midnight

Another notable feature of Winster village life in those earlier days was the Fish 'n Chip shop. Open until 1 'o clock in the morning, we are told that the "chippie" served just about everything good to eat, even fried eggs. It was quite common to "have a bit of fun" in those days, such as the time when two local lads decided to see who could eat the most boiled eggs. One managed 12 and the other 16, but we aren't told what happened to either of them afterwards!

Life in the village in the 1920's was thriving, although there were no buses, you couldn't just pop into Matlock to do your shopping, unless you had a horse and trap at your disposal. So most people did their shopping in the village.

In those days there were four butchers shops, a bank, three garages (including petrol), two bicycle shops, a Post Office, a Milliners, a Bakehouse and a Drapers. There were also sixteen pubs and ale houses.

The Bakehouse in particular was very popular, baking bread in traditional brick ovens, and people would come to Winster from as far away as Derby, Nottingham and Ripley to buy the bread with a "real" crust, "Not the Chewing Gum stuff you can buy today." In fact, the Bakehouse only closed about twenty years ago. Eric mourns that we are now down to just a Post Office, two shops and only two pubs.

Back in the '20s, Winster was a key village in the local area, serving the hundreds of mines which could be found in the surrounding countryside.

One of the first villages to get gas after Matlock it was a busy market 'town' which catered for everything. In fact, Winster has a tradition of trading and it is reported in the history books that when the Romans reached Matlock Bath they decided to stay there and not to tackle the "wild people" of Winster, preferring instead to trade with them.

Every Saturday night there was a dance in the Burton Institute, followed by a visit to the chip shop and then to find your way home as best you could.

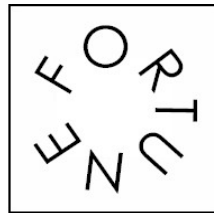

Public Toilets Consultation Begins

Local people and visitors to the Derbyshire Dales are being asked for their views on the future delivery of public toilet facilities in the district. Councillors last week approved the consultation, which includes an online survey at www.derbyshiredales.gov.uk/toiletsreview that runs until 20 October. The survey includes a question about the possible introduction of a charging policy initially for the use of loos in five busy locations - Matlock's Hall Leys Park, Bakewell's Granby Road, Ashbourne's Shawcroft, Matlock Bath's Memorial Gardens and Baslow. Consultees are asked if they would be prepared to pay for using a public toilet in the Dales and, if the answer is yes, how much - 10p, 20p, 30p, 50p or another amount. During the consultation the District Council will continue discussions with local town and parish councils and other potentially interested bodies on the possibility of transferring responsibility for some other public toilets in the Dales. The council currently provides a total of 26 public toilet facilities at a cost of £470,000 per year - and in March this year agreed to review public conveniences as one of its high priority measures in bridging a funding gap currently standing at £1.6-million over the next four years. The toilets review interim report can be viewed online at www.derbyshiredales.gov.uk/committee

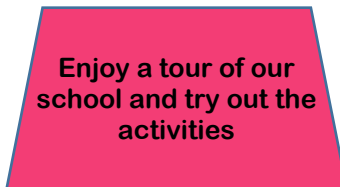

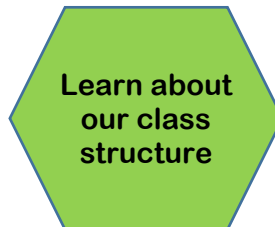

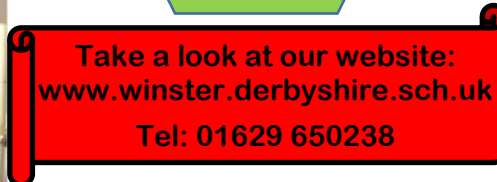
