The Better Derbyshire Dales Fund Closing Date For Applications

The Better Derbyshire Dales Fund is still going strong thanks to the commitment from the Derbyshire Dales District Council, Derbyshire County Council Public Health and North Derbyshire Clinical Commissioning Group.

Last financial year we received 65 applications over the four rounds and made 43 awards varying in size from a couple of hundred pounds to a few thousand pounds. These larger capital awards helped to improve community facilities such as Grindleford Pavilion, Cromford Community Centre, Hathersage Memorial Hall, Baslow Sports Pavilion, The Grand Pavilion Matlock Bath and Matlock Cricket Club.

Our next round closes on Friday 10th August 2018. Applicants can apply for up to £1,000 towards revenue costs and up to £5,000 for capital costs. We are particularly looking for applications that can demonstrate a health benefit to children and families or to older people; or that promote good mental health and emotional well-being in general.

WINSTER WAKES CARNIVAL - THE EAST BEAST - 2018

The third riding of 'The East Beast' cycle hill trial was won by Calum Brown from the Sheffield based Team B38/Underpin Racing in a record time of 46.6 seconds. This beat the 2016 best time of 55.2 seconds and the 2017 best time of 49.6 seconds. Thirty four riders from fourteen clubs, mainly from Derbyshire and South Yorkshire regions participated. One rider even came from Launceston Velo in Cornwall, competing for the second year running whilst holidaying in The Peak District.



The Carnival Committee are again grateful for the partnership with Matlock Cycling Club for organising the registration and timing of the event, which is advertised in the national calendar of cycling hill trials.

The event attracted ten junior riders, Kieran Smith of Bolsover coming third in 49.5 seconds. Winster juniors Alfie Clarke and Ben Robinson achieved creditable performances.

It has on the whole been a good year for the Burton Institute. We are pleased that the Pre-school are making good use of the building and income from their rental has made a major contribution to the overall finances. We are indebted to Winster Secret Gardens for their grant of money, which underwrites any financial loss and enables us to increase the reserve fund which at some stage we will need for any major works needed on the building. The plaque gas heaters required to be replaced before last winter, this was done at a very reasonable, though not insignificant cost. Issues with lack of ventilation for the heaters have hopefully now been resolved. It is hoped in the near future to replace the main lighting with dimmable LED's which will give more versatile lighting suitable for most users.

Cery's Review of 'Awful Auntie' by David Walliams

On Wednesday 13th June Winster Primary School headed off to The Lyceum Theatre in Sheffield to watch an afternoon performance of 'Awful Auntie' based on the book of the same title by the best-selling author David Walliams. The story starts off when Stella, the main character, sets off to visit London with her parents, Lord and Lady Saxby, she has no idea her life is in danger! Waking up three months later, only her Aunt Alberta can tell Stella what has happened. But not



everything Alberta tells her turns out to be true and Stella quickly discovers she's in for the fight of her life against her very own awful Auntie! Aunt Alberta tried to kill the whole family so that she could inherit the house to fund her addiction to Tiddlywinks! Stella is trapped, but soon discovers an unlikely helper in Soot – a ghost of a child sweep who was killed when he swept the chimney many years before. Alberta is unaware of Soot because ghosts can only be seen by children under the age of 13.

Unfortunately Alberta's pet owl Wagner can sense Soot's presence. Eventually Stella manages to work out what Aunt Alberta has done & she comes to a very unpleasant end but as this happens she turns 13 and loses being able to see and speak to Soot (who was Alberta's brother who she mistreated as a child – what a thoroughly nasty person Alberta always was!). But Stella changes the house so that it is a home for children that do not have families.



The play looks at different types of child abuse such as neglect and violence and how difficult it can be for children to be heard by adults so there is an atmosphere of fear through most of the play, but Soot represents that help and friendship can come in unexpected ways. The play also tells us about the importance of kindness and loyalty. This is shown through my favourite character, Gibbon, the butler. Gibbon is probably the worst butler in the world – he is always getting things wrong & this is done in a funny way, otherwise the play could be very depressing! Stella's parents kept Gibbon as part of the family as they didn't want to see him without a place to live. In modern day we would probably think that Gibbon has dementia and he would go into a home but the play is set in the 1930's and this was before the NHS was set up.

I've seen the play twice now; I've also read the book and have the audio book too – so I would definitely recommend it to a friend. Most of David Walliam's books are set in the present time – this is the only one I can think of that is set in a different point in time (though it finishes with Stella as an old lady) and I think it stands out for that.



Winster Churchyard Gates

You may have noticed that the gates at either end of the churchyard (Elton Road and West Bank) have been removed for works. In consultation with representatives from the church and Parish Council, we are having the two gates restored and repainted in memory of our parents - Marie (nee Burton) and Jack Hession - mum a lifelong resident of Winster and dad for almost 60 years since they married in 1957 at Winster Church.

Hopefully the works will be finished late summer and we'll arrange with Stephen Monk a little dedication / blessing ceremony as part of a regular service.

St. John The Baptist Church Winster

The central worship for the Church of God is the Eucharist, also called Holy Communion; the Lord's Supper; the Mass. It's celebrated in various ways all valid and all acts of Worship. But they have the same elements in them; the same actions. The following bold words are at the heart of the Eucharist. **Whenever we come together around the table, take bread, bless it, break it, and give it to one another saying: "The Body of Christ,"** we know that Jesus is among us. The Eucharist pushes all Christians to go out to serve; to love; to seek reconciliation; to seek dialogue; to bring together people of all creeds, cultures and faiths. To help foster fellowship. If the act of celebrating Holy Communion or the Eucharist doesn't foster the things I've mentioned, then we're not really understanding the deep endless meaning of what it means to be Christian and what it means to truly celebrate the Eucharist. Eucharist means thankfulness, or to give thanks. We give thanks for our church; our local community; our country; all people in need and all who have much. But this Thankfulness isn't passive, it's extremely active. By being thankful, we are called to serve and do the things I've already mentioned. The Eucharist isn't a reward for really wonderful and holy Christians. It is a Divine medicine which touches the most sinful or broken of people. We who call ourselves Christian must not just solemnly attend the Eucharist, we must live the Eucharist now more than ever in our fractured and broken world. We must be a balm of healing and love. If you don't often come to Holy Communion - why not give it a try in any of our local churches or chapels? Allow the Lord to bring you His love and Healing. With my love and prayers for a wonderful summer.

A very big thank you for everyone who helped with the celebration of our Wakes service. I've had a lot of great feedback this year, but I wish to continue in improving the service, so that it is both inclusive and also a joyful act of worship.
