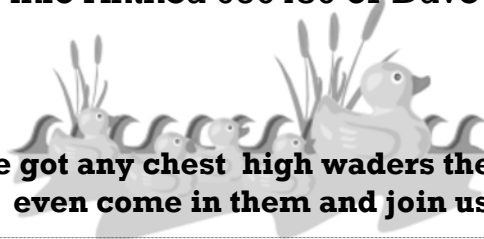

We felt this a fitting tribute to their memory – not only a connection to St John the Baptist Church, but also for the enjoyment of the many locals and visitors who walk through the churchyard in our beautiful village.

Mobile phones in the Peak District

Whichever network you choose, there are parts of the Peak District where your phone will have no signal, but other networks work happily.

If you need to dial 999 (or 112 - it's exactly the same), your phone will use any network that can deliver you a signal. But what if you are somewhere without coverage on your normal network and need to make an important but non-emergency call, or to receive a call?

The least-bad solution I have found so far is to buy a separate, simple, mobile (plenty of pretty compact ones available at around £20) to take when you really need to keep in touch.

The secret is to use a **Manx Telecom** pay-as-you-go SIM (available online: free when you buy £5 credit). Why Manx?

- The Isle of Man is **not** part of the UK (nor the EU), so calls to/from Manx Telecom SIMs are treated as foreign calls, which will roam to provide service to you wherever any of the four UK mobile networks have coverage.
- But the Isle of Man **is** part of the UK telephone code system. So the SIM has an "07" phone code like other mobiles

The downside is cost:

- Calls from the mobile to a UK number will cost 44p per minute: no good for chatting, but fair value if it saves a wasted journey or lets you sort something out before people get too upset.
- Calls to the mobile will cost more than usual for most people – IoM calls are generally excluded from bundles.

But as a way of being reachable around as much of the Peak District as possible, it is the best option I've found so far - I've been using this approach for a couple of months and it works fine.

My wife often likes romantic comedies I normally read while they are playing on the TV (what does that say about me?) But love is so very important. Love is something that gives us a place for encounter. As a priest much of my role is to encounter love. Love in the joy of a Baptism or a Wedding or in the affirmation of love of God in the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. Yet there's a deeper love we often remember the more painful love; love of a person whose preparing the Funeral Service or the Remembrance service for their loved ones. Anyone who is open to life's rhythm knows that love can be the point of highest emotion - overpowering when we embrace someone we love. But also the deep painful love of loss, regret or pain. Often pain comes from the regret of remaining silent when we need to speak. Without words, it is hard to love well. When we say to our parents, children, lovers, or friends: "I love you very much" or "I care for you" or "I think of you often" or "You are my greatest gift," we choose to give life. It is not always easy to express our love directly in words. But whenever we do, we discover we have offered a blessing that will be long remembered. When a son can say to his father, "Dad, I love you," and when a mother can say to her daughter, "Child, I love you," a whole new blessed place can be opened up, a space where it is good to dwell. Indeed, words have the power to create life Love when treated with reverence is a common language for all humanity. The church is certainly not perfect - it has shadows, pain, sin and is sometimes evil. But the true open, transparent Church of Christ is that simple message: "God (creator, redeemer, sustainer) loves you passionately. God loves you with unconditional love. As we move from the heat of summer to the coolness of autumn let the beauty of nature remind us that we are loved. Loving can be costly, even to the point of giving up ones life. But our faith tells us to die to self is to then live in the eternal now of God; the eternal love of God. I challenge myself and my congregation and each person of our community to try to love more, forgive more, serve more and make our local community and our world a better place. Can't people of faith and people of no faith unite in this endeavour? To love more and to tell those closest to us that we love them. I wish you all an October and an Autumn full of love. Love that you give and love that you receive. Amen.
