St John the Baptist Finances

We at St John's would love the church to be used more by the village, for various activities as well as church services. However, we recognise it is not the warmest of buildings or the most flexible! We are hoping to renew the heating system and remove some pews at the back of church to give us extra space. That's hopefully the good news. People in the past have been very generous and bequeathed money to St John's. However, in some cases it was stipulated that the capital cannot be used, only the interest. While this was great in the days of high interest rates, obviously now this income is considerably reduced. In other cases, the money is

ringfenced for specific purposes. As a result our current income does not cover general expenses and we have concerns for the future. If we get the go-ahead for our planned improvements, some of the cost can be met from the fabric fund but we would have to put out an appeal for financial help. Any present financial help towards maintaining the church would be greatly appreciated. 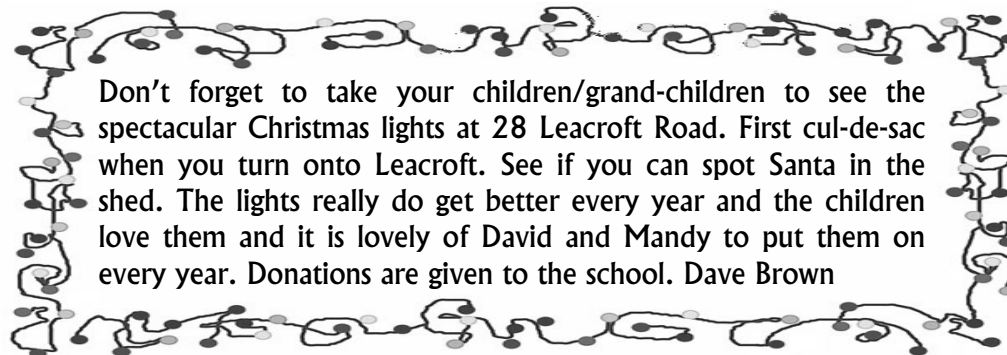

Councillor's Corner

Christmas bin collections

Bin collections in Winster in the two weeks AFTER Christmas day will be one day LATER than usual. So, as bins are normally collected on a Wednesday, they will be collected on a Thursday following Christmas Day. Your recycling (blue bin/blue box and bag) will be collected on Thursday 27 December 2018. Your grey bin or black sacks will be collected on Thursday 4 January 2019.

- Garden waste collections will be suspended from 22 December to 5 January inclusive.
- Food waste will still be collected weekly over the Christmas period as normal. REAL Christmas trees will be collected from the edge of your property between Monday 7 January and Friday 1 February for collection. Please make sure all decorations are removed!
- Non-glitter cards and wrapping paper can be left in your blue bin insert or blue bag.
- Crews WILL NOT be able to collect any additional household waste. So, please make sure all household waste is contained in your grey bin or 4 black standard sized sacks on collections day.
- Crews WILL take excess recycling. Simply place extra materials at the side of your recycling containers, making sure it is easily identifiable as recycling materials.

The search for a new waste contract begins...

As you might be aware, the District Council has started the process of finding a new contract to continue its refuse collection services from 2020. At a special meeting of the Full Council on 29 November, members supported a recommendation by officers that would see general waste and recycling continue to be collected fortnightly and food waste weekly. It was also agreed to bring in a charge for fortnightly garden waste – which has yet to be specified. Local Councils do not legally have to collect garden waste and residents will have to 'opt in' and will not have to buy into it.

As your representative, I supported these measures. With the Council's funding from central government reducing year-on-year and savings having to be made, a wide range of options had to be considered as to how best we can provide waste collection services on a tight budget. These options including waste collections every 3 or 4 weeks.

Residents told me that their top priority was to maintain fortnightly collections. The introduction of a charge for garden waste, therefore, was something I regrettably had to accept to ensure the District Council could keep the frequency of collections the same as they currently are.

With the basics now agreed, the District Council will put together a specification which will be put to potential bidders for the new contract. As things progress and develop, more detail about the future shape of waste collection services will become clear and I will keep residents updated. With all of the problems residents encountered with the roll out of the current contract, please be assured I am keeping a close eye on this matter and scrutinising it at every possible stage.

I would like to wish everybody a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.
