Recipe Corner: Mustard Crusted Hogget Breast

Serves 2 @ circa £2.50 per person.

Winster folk : Please share your favourite recipes & local dishes, home crops, home made goodies , brews & preserves - don't be shy!

April's recipe page is sponsored by Glyn Hughes' Foods of England project. Glyn will immediately point out that 'recipe' is French, 'receipt' is the correct terminology!

Here's a budget conscious Easter meal using local Derbyshire produce and an overlooked cheaper cut of meat. Popular mid century British cook Elizabeth David's Lamb Ste-Ménéhould, has been thoroughly anglicised to become 'Mustard Crusted Hogget'. Hogget is an older lamb, full flavoured and in season now before the English spring lambs are fattened up. 500g breast serves 2.



Stage 1 - Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Peel, chop 4 small carrots, 1 leek, small onion, stick of celery, 3 cloves garlic. Sweat for 5 mins, add to roasting dish. Add small bunch thyme, sprig rosemary, and 2 bay leaves. Lay Derbyshire hogget breast(s) bones in - on top, skin up. Pour over 500ml of stock, season well, cover tightly with a sheet of foil. Cook the meat, undisturbed, for 2½ - 3 hrs, (Or as I did - slow cooker 8hrs on low) . Meat should be falling off the bone - if

not, extend cooking time. Leave to cool slightly before gently pulling out the bones, discard skin & excess fat. Pour juices and veg into a container, chill. Can be prepared up to 2 days in advance. **Stage 2** - Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Lay the meat in a roasting tin, brush with English mustard, quantity to your taste! Pack over 25g breadcrumbs. Bake for 30 mins - until the crumbs are toasted & crispy. Skim off fat & warm the sauce. Lift hogget onto a board, thickly slice. Serve with the veggies in sauce, extra spring veg and sautéed potatoes. Recipe adapted from BBC Good Food. **Source ingredients:** order in the (bone in) hogget breast joint from local butchers, or the village shop where you can also find all the other ingredients.

John Geddes successfully applied for a grant from the Community Champions scheme to cover our start up costs. At the same time the Morgue was renovated, and the photocopier installed. With a 'public' computer it was soon known as the only Cyber Morgue in the UK.

"Christmas and Easter can be subjects for poetry, but Good Friday, like Auschwitz, cannot. The reality is so horrible it is not surprising that people should have found it a stumbling block to faith." W H Auden

This may be seen as a controversial quotation from WH Auden. After all the enormity of this infamous town in Poland still evokes the power of the totalitarian state to simply murder those who are different. Those who are of a different faith, sexuality, colour, political allegiance; those whose IQ isn't as high as someone else's. Today in our traditional church services, or our outdoor acts of witness, or our ecumenical meetings, or our Evangelical outreach to 'save your souls', none of these traditions, nor modern acts can touch the horror, the disgust, the pain and the total disaster of Good Friday. Good Friday is so far from respectability, bland religiosity, one hour slot in church; it's so far from the innate tradition to fast a little and eat fish. Good Friday should bring us to our knees. It should bring tears into our hearts as well as our eyes. Because Good Friday is the total misunderstanding of humanity to the offer of God's grace, mercy and love. But what could God do? He sent His Son to come and preach and teach and love and forgive etc. Yet still the Good News wasn't getting through. So, God allowed Jesus to freely offer Himself in a total way. Jesus allowed himself to be beaten, his clothes torn off, a heavy beam on his back, and that final short walk to the place of the skull, the place of death and failure. Jesus did all this, he allowed himself to be abused and destroyed and murdered so that the cycle of violence can be stopped. Jesus looked out from the Cross with love not hatred. Jesus taught from the Cross "Love is stronger than hate." And in a mysterious way Jesus allowed the whole of the glorious and suffering and broken sinful condition of humanity be felt at the very heart of God. The result being those who suffer natural illness or vile abuse are never alone. God walks with them. Jesus understands their fears and agony. That is the Message of Good Friday, God is now truly with us. In our pain and sorrow. In Auschwitz, in Rwanda, in Syria, in North Korea. Jesus is there in Calow Hospital, in the Whitworth Hospital; in our nursing homes and in our private homes. God is with us. When the world brings us to our knees (and it does to everyone at some time) Jesus kneels with us. He loves us and blesses us and holds us close. We are not alone. This leads us to the truth which C. D. Lounsbrough sums up well, "Easter is a time when God turned the inevitability of death into the invincibility of life." The crucified love of God is with us to the end of time. May we love as God in Jesus loves. May we serve as Jesus served and may we help people find new life and a realisation that they are truly the beloved. God bless you and your loved ones. Have a Blessed Holy week and a joyful Easter.
