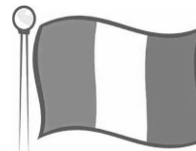

Councillor's Corner

Clarification on Garden Waste Charges

A number of people have recently contacted me to ask when charges for the collection of garden waste will come into effect and how much it will be. The charges and when they will be brought in have not yet been agreed. At this stage they are only proposals which have been set out in the new waste contract which will begin in August 2020 - when the current contract with Serco will come to an end. If charges are brought in for garden waste, they might not even start until 2021. The new contract is currently being reviewed by potential contactors and hasn't yet gone through a formal tendering process. So, things could still change in the months ahead and I will continue to keep you updated as the new contract begins to take shape. For now, garden waste collections remain free of charge for at least another year.

Food caddy Liners

Free food caddy liners are currently being delivered to households across Derbyshire Dales. Residents who have subscribed to the District Council's compostable sack scheme for garden waste will also receive a free roll of 42 compostable sacks. Properties that currently use black sacks for household waste can subscribe to the compostable sack scheme for garden waste online. Any household that has not received their caddy liners or compostable sacks by the end of May should contact the District Council no later than the end of June on 01629 761100.

As always, please get in touch with me if you have any issues with waste collection services or the delivery of your caddy liners and compostable sacks.

"ANTHEA'S PIECE" – WILDLIFE HAVEN

Most villagers will know Anthea Rawlence. She and husband Clive Newton have been residents of Winster for many years. Anthea has been, and still is, involved in lots of village activities. Her longest running project was 34 years as volunteer compiler and editor of Winster's monthly news magazine from 1982 to 2016. This could not have been an easy task as, before personal computers and the internet, we left hand written 'notes', for magazine copy, at the Post Office or her home. These 'notes' she needed to interpret, type out and fit into available magazine space.

This was an epic much valued undertaking so we villagers wish to pay tribute to Anthea by saying 'thank you' for her long and never failing endeavours. To do this a row of fruit trees, have already been planted, in Winster's Pond and Community Orchard section of the Woodhouse Lane play and conservation area. This zig zag row is the first you see when visiting the orchard before reaching the pond.

To enhance the tribute a "wildlife haven", with wildflower bank, has been designed. This will be constructed as curved dry stone walling, using limestone, with oak log insert, for a bug home. The structure will be built, at the west end of the row of dedicated fruit trees, near the pathway. It should attract and be a haven for all types of wildlife. A small plaque will be incorporated into the structure which will give basic information and say 'Thank You Anthea'. The trees and wildlife haven area will be known as 'ANTHEA'S PIECE'.

If you would like to contribute towards this exciting project, Caz at the Post Office in the Shop will have a collection box.

Recipe Corner - Judy's Marmalade Bread and Butter Pudding

This month's recipe was submitted by Winsters resident **Judy Hinsliff**, she describes it as delicious and fool proof (now, there's a challenge!). She loves to make this when her family visits. Even her daughter, who doesn't like B&B Pudding, adores this tangy orange version by Delia Smith.



Ingredients & Method

Pre heat oven 180C / 350F / GM4. Generously butter 6 slices crust on bread on one side, spread 2 tbsp marmalade over 3 slices, sandwich together. Butter the top of each sandwich and cut into 4 triangles. Arrange neatly, buttered side up, in a well buttered 18x23cm baking dish. Whisk 275 ml milk, 60 ml cream, 3 eggs, 75g sugar, pour over bread. Scatter over grated zest of a large orange, 1 tbsp demerara sugar & 25g candied peel. Place on high shelf. Bake for 35-40 minutes until puffy, golden & crunchy on top. Serve immediately with cream and enjoy.

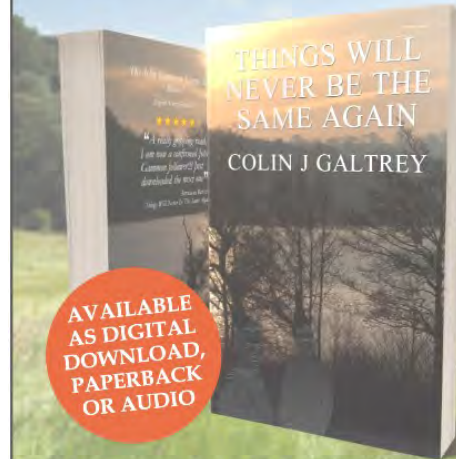

Being cynical isn't a great thing for a Christian. But having a sense of humour is!! This week we celebrate the Holy Trinity. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Three persons, one God etc. It's always funny to hear sermons on this Truth, because 99% of preachers end up heretics!! Sadly today we believe in another Trinity!! *"The modern holy trinity is money, sex, and celebrities"* - PD James. This seems very apt at the moment. After all this week 'Love Island' has started again. PD James words seems very true!! PD James Trinity is opposite to our Christian belief in the Trinity. PD James's trinity implies worth, value, respect, uniqueness - all come from outside. Whereas God says, you're perfect as you are, though through the 'Fall' we no longer see ourselves as God sees us and that affects the way we live. The Holy Trinity is about God valuing humanity as we are. God values each person on the earth. God values and loves the saint and the sage and the sinner. God calls us to value who we are as people. As individuals and as communities. The Holy Trinity is a mystery and though in our world today we dislike things we cannot understand. Who's been ill and said, "God if you take away my pain, depression, fears, tumours then I'll be a good person, I'll live a new life". Sadly, since God doesn't work like this we often set ourselves up for sadness. Does God want us to suffer? The answer is of course no. God the Holy Trinity wants us to flourish, to love, to build up community and live out our lives fully and joyfully. We'll not answer the mystery of suffering here, but the comment I wish to make is that God didn't do some Hollywood style razzmatazz and make everything well. Sadly, we live in a broken world and we are broken people. We have free will. God chose to allow His Son into that broken world to experience it and love, heal, bring hope and peace and ultimately die for all of humanity. God in Jesus died for us so that we may know His peace and joy. God the Holy Trinity reached out in love and peace to bring us home. God walks along with us in our sufferings and needs and he always calls us home. To me this is the mystery of the Holy Trinity. Why would God (in Jesus) suffer terribly and die for us? Why would God be totally alienated and alone, for us?
