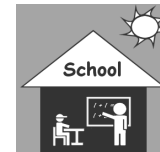

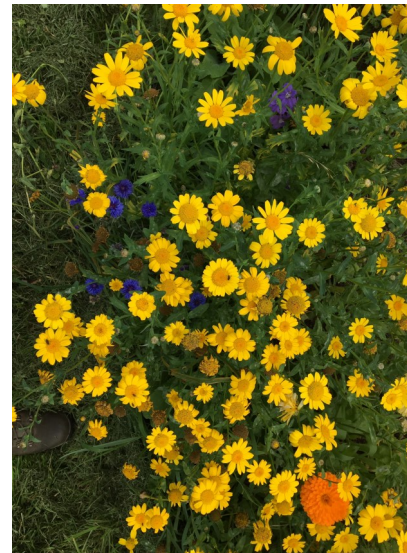
It is an evening of fascinating and exciting music - a fusion of Balkan Roma music and international folk dances with elements of jazz and

Recipe Corner—Alison's Sticky Toffee Apple Pudding (serves 6)

Faced with a glut of apples? If not don't worry, the village shop often sells locally grown fruit in Autumn. Here's a family favourite recipe from Winster resident Alison Gray using delicious seasonal fruit. It's fabulous hot, straight from the oven, or cold the next day - the choice is yours!

Heat the oven to 180° C / 350° F / Gas 4. Grease a 2 litre shallow oven dish.


Prepare 3- 4 cooking apples (peeled/ cored / sliced), set aside in a bowl, covered in water so that they don't go brown. Sieve 150 g self raising flour, 100g sugar, 1 table-spoon baking powder and pinch of salt into a bowl. In another bowl, mix 160ml milk, 75g melted butter and 1 beaten egg. Drain the apples and place in the bottom of the oven dish, fill it about 1/3 full. Add milk mixture to the dry ingredients. Stir well to make a smooth batter. Pour into oven dish, covering the apples. Use a spoon to push the apples down, to make sure they are all coated. To make the toffee sauce: Pour 250ml boiling water over 150 g soft dark brown sugar and a pinch salt. Stir until smooth. Pour liquid over pudding (it will sink to the bottom of the dish). Bake for 40 minutes until risen and golden. Photo Alison Gray.

She said in her diary that often in her life and ministry she felt like God was absent. Imagine, spending years looking after the poorest of the poor and the people who died in total poverty. Mother Teresa was a woman of great faith yet she, for most of her life, had a spiritual darkness. Sometimes we judge our prayer life or our relationship with God on how we 'feel'. But this isn't a good measurement. So many things can affect how I feel. For example did I sleep last night, am I in pain, have I recently been ill or have I had stress at work or in school? All these things can make a difference to how I feel. On a deeper level or with Christian discipline Mother Teresa knew God loved her just as he loved the poor, the sick and the dying whom she cared for in his name. As the seasons change, as some people get up in darkness and come home from work in darkness - some people have SAD syndrome. Often what we need to do is be gentle with ourselves. Simply be still and know that God is our Sovereign - However we feel, God loves us all. God wants us to tell him our joys and sorrows and hopes and fears. May your faith be a light in the world even if it's just a little flicker. So as we move through the month of October like Mother Teresa - know that you are immensely special to God. You and all people of our world are loved by God. How can we live out this love? How can we be like Mother Teresa and serve all people of our communities and those who live abroad?
