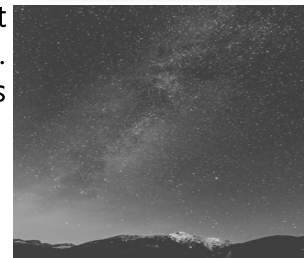

I am aware that many properties in Winster continue to have problems with their waste collections. Please be assured that I am doing what I can to get the any waste backlog removed and collections back to normal as soon as possible. Sadly, it would appear that things are only going to get worse before they get better.

The latest update from the Council paints a very bleak picture. We have been told that SERCO are losing more HGV drivers than they are recruiting. This means that there are fewer crews emptying bins each day and some rounds will have to be missed altogether. SERCO haven't provided any details about how they plan to clear all of the waste that will be left uncollected. .

To add to this, a number of SERCO staff will now be taking industrial action over pay and conditions. Not all staff are union members, so it is hard to tell how badly this will impact the service.

A number of residents have got in touch with me to express their anger and annoyance at the situation and asking when their waste will be removed. I completely understand your frustration and can only apologise for the inconvenience.

Regrettably, with the situation being so dire, I cannot provide any guarantees as to when crews will return for uncollected waste or when the service will begin to improve. I know that this is not good enough, but I will continue to help those of you who have been worst affected.

In the meantime, here is my advice to residents who have uncollected waste...

1. Leave your bins, containers and sacks out on the kerbside for collection if they are missed. If refuse crews return unannounced, your waste will not be missed.
2. Please continue to report missed collections through the council website. I appreciate that this might seem pointless and you might not get a response, but every complaint about a helps to build-up a case against SERCO for failing to meet their contractual obligations. Please use the online reporting form where possible rather than telephoning the council to reduce pressure on our overstretched staff.
3. Store all excess waste and recycling securely to prevent it being attacked by animals or blowing away. Keep the opening side of your bin lid against a wall or your property to prevent the wind blowing it open and scattering the contents.
4. Please continue to sperate-out all excess recycling into individual containers, Where possible, please use clear or open-top containers (not sacks or bags) to allow waste crews to identify the contents.
5. Please continue to report any missed collections to me by emailing colin.swindell@derbyshiredales.gov.uk. Provide me with your address and what waste has been missed.



I continue to feedback all information to a council officer who is helping to clear any waste backlog in Winster. Your feedback will also help me to build a picture of where and what the problems are.

I am assured that council officers are doing all they can, legally and financially, to hold SERCO to account for failing to deliver the service. I also continue to work and talk with other councillors to explore what steps we can take to bring about solutions and get things under control. Again, I apologise for any inconvenience you might be having and I will keep you updated as things develop. Please contact me if you need help with you waste services or if you have any other issues of concern.

Love in a Box – Shoeboxes



It is great to be getting ready for shoe boxes again this year. Flat-pack boxes and information leaflets can be picked up from the shop from the beginning of November. Contact me if you wish to get these earlier. The filled boxes need to be returned to the shop (or to me) by the end of **Saturday, 13th November** so I can get them to the drop-off location the following week.

Information on how to pack the boxes, including suggestions of what to put in and a list of what not to put in the boxes, can be found in the leaflet or on the website at <https://www.samaritans-purse.org.uk> which contains a bit more info. I have noticed this year for the first time on the website that T-shirts are in the suggested list as well as hats, scarves, gloves, socks. It is good to pack a range of items which will help the children in different areas of their lives: stationary which would help with school work, non-liquid hygiene items like wrapped soap or a toothbrush, toys and small clothing items as mentioned above. Please note we cannot include any food including sweets, any fluids or toothpaste. As before a £5 donation is requested to cover the transport costs – preferably this can be given through the web-site. If you wish to give cash, instead of putting it in the box this year they are asking it to be sent in the pre-paid envelope attached to the leaflet. I really enjoy making and buying items for the boxes. However, if you don't have time to fill a box yourself, you can always do one on-line through the above web-site. Whichever we do, it is lovely to know that our boxes can bring a lot of joy to children in some of the world's poorest communities.

Recipe corner— Garlicky Tomato and Pepper Soup, A perfect Winsters winter warmer supper!



At 200 degrees/ GM6, roast 15 fresh tomatoes, 5 cloves garlic , a red pepper (seeds & stalk removed) a peeled & roughly chopped red onion, spritzed with a little olive oil in an oven proof dish until breaking down starting to brown (approx. 20 minutes). Allow to cool then squeeze out the roasted garlic cloves discarding the skin. You can precook the veg whilst you have the oven on and store the mixture in the fridge for up to 3 days until you're ready to use it. Add 400g tin chopped tomatoes then use the tin to measure 1 can of water to use all the remaining tomato juice, 1 tsp of dried basil, pinch of salt and pepper, 1/4 tsp chilli flakes, 2 tsp of maple syrup (1 tsp of sugar is fine as an alternative) 1 tbsp tomato puree and if available a few chopped sundried tomatoes into your pre heated slow cooker, along with the precooked roast vegetable mixture. Slow cook for 2 hours on low, the perfect time to go out for a walk ?! (You can also use a normal saucepan and hob, the soup will need approx. 15 minutes on simmer until the vegetables are soft.)Blend with a stick blender or in a food processor , taste and adjust salt, pepper, sugar to your taste. Swirl in a little pesto or sour cream. Serve with crusty bread and a roaring fire!

DISCOVERY OF SAXON GRAVES.—A discovery of considerable interest, throwing much light upon the funeral rites of our Saxon ancestors previous to their conversion to Christianity, was accidentally made during the past week, in the garden attached to the residence of Charles Carill Worsley, Esq., at Winster, in this county. Whilst lowering a bank of earth for the purpose of making some improvements in the pleasure ground, the labourers uncovered two graves at the depth of upwards of four feet from the present surface, each containing a human skeleton, lying on its right side, with the knees drawn up and the head pointing towards the north-east. The first skeleton was accompanied by a small spear head, or knife, of iron, much corroded, and the lower stone of a hand-mill, anciently used in every household for grinding corn. With the second interment was found the upper stone of the same mill, very neatly wrought in sandstone, but split to pieces by the great heat to which it had been exposed. Some pieces of a very coarse vessel of plain earthenware were found near the head of this skeleton, and behind it lay a large spear head, of iron, two feet long, a curved instrument of the same metal, five inches long, originally fixed in a wooden handle, the bone ferule of which still remains, and a ring-like bead or decoration of light coloured porcelain, about an inch and a half in diameter. The whole of the articles exhumed from these graves (which may be assigned to the Teutonic or Tiron period, including the time from the end of the 5th to the 7th century, A.D.) by the kindness of C. Carill Worsley, Esq., have been deposited in Mr. Bateman's Museum of Antiquities, at Lomberdale House.

A small team of us have been working through the Historic Newspaper Archive to find references to Winster for the Census/Old Houses project. Some articles we read are funny, interesting or intriguing whilst others are very sad. It is fascinating to read these snapshots of history and to gain an insight into the people who lived here over 100 years ago. Over the course of the next few months there will be more of these for you to enjoy and read. Jo Banks

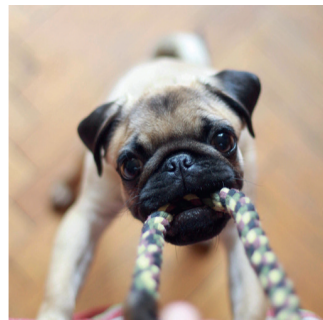

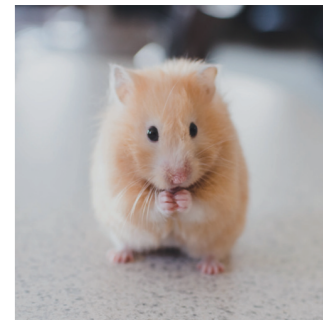

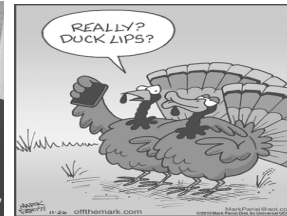

Letter from Reverend Stephen Monk

The Church hasn't always been respectful of women. In fact it seems safe to say that religion in general had very little respect for women, and their talents and their lives and even their skills. I want to state clearly that in our Benefice no one has the right to judge another person because of their sex, sexuality, age, background or economic circumstance. If you feel that Jesus and religion gives one the right to do any of the above then you don't know Jesus and you've misunderstood what religion is about. Thinking of this, I want to ask; do you feel loved? I know this question can be embarrassing, but I want to ask you again Post Covid, do you really feel loved? Do you feel loved by your family, your partner and also by God? In November we remember lots of people who we may well have loved. We celebrate the Feast of All Saints – this is the people who have been men, women and children whose lives have poured out love into our world. Then there's the feast of All Souls, this is the feast where we remember our family members or friends or people who live in our communities. Our Prayer for them is summed up in the old prayer "May they rest in Peace and Rise in Glory." The glory is the gift Jesus gave to all of us from the Cross. His love poured out upon our world down the years to tell all people that, they are supremely precious in God's eyes.

Someone Jesus loved was, Mary of Magdala. These two people loved each other. (After His three days in the tomb, Jesus, in the love of His Father, He rose from the dead.) Jesus says, "Mary." She recognizes him and says, "Rabboni" which means Master (John 20:16). This simple and deeply moving story brings me in touch with my fear as well as my desire to be known. Often I am tempted to think that I am loved only as I remain partially unknown. But God loves the real you! I fear that the love I receive is conditional and then say to myself, "If they really knew me, they would not love me." But when Jesus calls Mary by name he speaks to her entire being. And that's just how God sees all of us. Mary realizes that the One who knows her most deeply is not moving away from her, but is coming to her offering her his unconditional love. Mary feels at once fully known and fully loved. As Henri Nouwen said: *The division between what she feels safe to show and what she does not dare to reveal no longer exists. She is fully seen and she knows that the eyes that see her are the eyes of forgiveness, mercy, love, and unconditional acceptance. . . .* What a joy to be fully known and fully loved at the same time! It is the joy of belonging through Jesus to God and being fully safe and fully free. In November, may you remember those who you have loved but also remember that you are loved by God; By God's Church and By your family and friends. May God's love enfold you because, and I truly mean this, you are immensely precious and you are very special. With my prayers and very best wishes.
