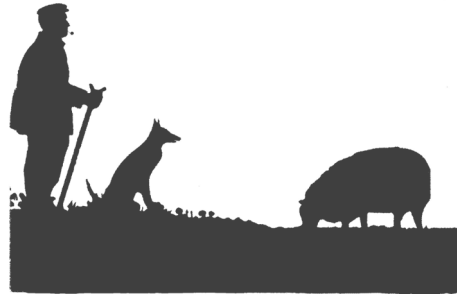

Government consultation on easier planning permission in National Parks

The government is consulting on a proposal to give "presumed consent" to the conversion of agricultural buildings in National Parks for residential use. I think that many people in Winster may want to express a view on this.

The following are my personal views.

As I understand it, "presumed consent" changes the obligation from the applicant saying why a development is OK (which is the current situation) to allowing every application to go ahead unless the Peak Park Authority is able to make a strong case why it shouldn't. And with the 40% cut in resources for the Park over recent years, there is a real risk that they simply won't have the staff in post to successfully resist even the most extreme proposals (which are likely to come in quite a rush if the changes go through). I think that is dangerous.

The proposals do have some sensible limitations specific to National Parks - from my reading of the proposal it will only apply to buildings with a ground floor space of at least 37 sqm (which will rule out many field barns), and the consent would not cover extensions behind existing buildings (which are proposed as OK elsewhere).

But there seems to be a strong risk of ugly conversions in really inappropriate locations. And I fear that there could be a "conveyor belt" of new residential properties on farm land - if I have read it correctly, a farmer could build a new barn, use it for that purpose for two years, then convert the barn to a bungalow. Then a little while later, decide they need another new barn, which after two years can be converted to a bungalow ... and so on, apparently without limit.

The proposals have been announced (rather quietly) in the middle of the holiday season, with a relatively early deadline for responses. I wrote immediately to our MP, Sarah Dines, to ask her view. She responded impressively quickly - to ask me to point her to the relevant website as she clearly hadn't heard about it. And in nearly a fortnight since, it seems that she hasn't managed to find out enough to offer her considered opinion. I will share her response as and when I receive it.

The only national media coverage has been in the Guardian - they quoted the Chief Exec of the Yorkshire Dales National Park as saying it would "essentially lead ... to the destruction of the National Park".



Apparently the CPRE are working on a response, and perhaps other bodies too, but at the time of writing, there has been a deafening silence from elsewhere.

I would urge people to read up on the proposals - I have created a page on the Village Website with links to both the government document and to the Guardian article (shortcut: tinyurl.com/np-prop-23, also linked in the News section). As and when I hear views from anywhere else, I will add those too. Parish Council will be considering a response at their meeting on 4th September, and I will add a copy of whatever is produced on the website. And if anyone else has a view on the proposals (for or against), please send me a PDF and I will link it from the website.

The consultation closes on 25 September - it may pay to wait a little longer before responding in case CPRE or others come up with angles not covered by the Guardian article, but I do urge people to make sure that their views are heard.

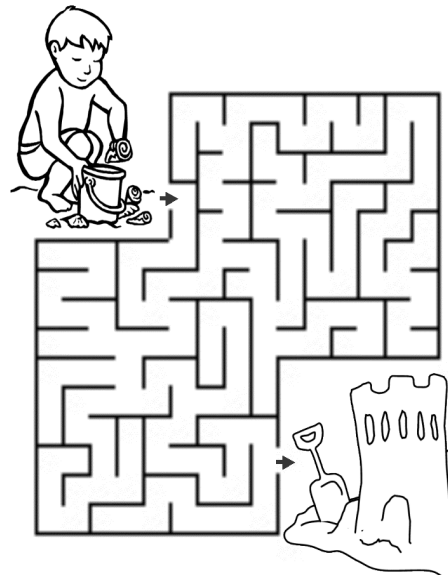

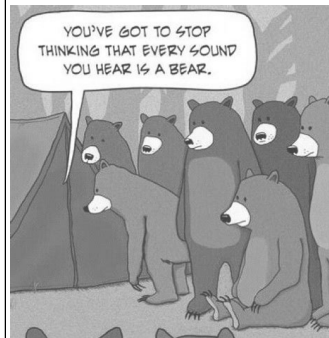
