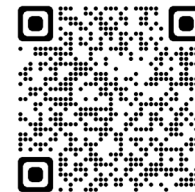

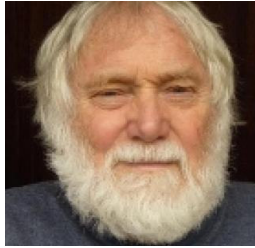

June 1, 1943 - August

On 30th September there will be a memorial service for John, "A Celebration of his Life" as he preferred to call it. It will be at midday at St John's Church in Winstar followed by a reception at the Burton Institute. The Old Bowling Green pub will also be open from midday.

We will play some of John's favourite music, sing two of his favourite hymns, Winstar choir will also lead the singing. There will be members of our family and friends talking about their memories of John's life.

He was an NHS dentist in Bakewell for 40 years, a governor at Lady Manner's School for 10 years and chair for 5 years, supporting Winstar for 26 years in so many different ways; founded the charity Vasculitis UK in 2009; volunteering for over 12 years. This year John received the MBE for his charity work.

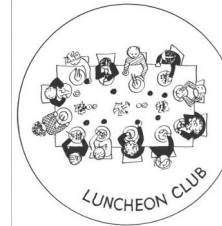

## Operation Christmas Child Shoe boxes

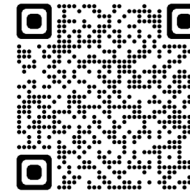
Boxes filled with toys, stationary and other items are sent to children in some of the world's poorest regions. There are 3 age ranges for the boxes, 2 – 4, 5 – 9, 10 – 14. There are leaflets which tell you what can and cannot be packed – please note we can't send sweets, liquids of any kind, toothpaste...

The flat-pack shoe boxes and leaflets containing labels for the boxes and information on what to put in them will be available in the shop from the beginning of November and the shop has again kindly said that the filled boxes can be returned there. Ordinary shoe boxes covered in wrapping paper can also be used.

A £5 donation per box is asked for to cover the transport cost – this can be given on-line or a cheque sent in the envelope attached to the leaflet.

The boxes need to be handed in to the shop by Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> Nov so I can take them across to Chesterfield the following week.

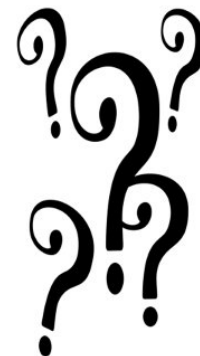

### **Wildflower Seeding**

We would like to thank the numerous residents who have been turning out to help for the weeding and seeding events up at the common over the last 12 months. Their hard work is starting to pay dividends with not only an increase in biodiversity, but some really interesting species establishing such as the bee orchid.

We are hoping that you remain enthusiastic as we are planning a couple of new events for this autumn in 2 locations. The first will be down at the green in Leacroft on the 30<sup>th</sup> September. The District Council had approached the Parish Council last year about leaving this area uncut so it would develop into a meadow. Some people have been disappointed that this did not happen after a mix up between DDC and their contractor. Others were slightly concerned that this area would look overgrown and unkept. So now with the generosity of our new Derbyshire Dales District Councillor, Matt Buckler, we have been given a £250 grant to wildflower seed the area. Please join us at 10am on Sat 30<sup>th</sup> if you would like to help with the seeding.

The second event will take place up at the common in November when we will be spread a lot of yellow rattle seed. We would really like to get this plant established as it will help to suppress the grasses and give the other flowers more of a fighting chance to take over. ## *Letter from Reverend Stephen Monk*

*"Most studies into the role of religiousness in relation to depression severity have mainly found an inverse relationship between greater religiousness and lower levels of depressive symptoms. There is reason to assume that religiousness has a buffering effect on the relationship between stressful life events and depressive symptoms. The aim of this study was to investigate the role of religiousness in moderating the impact of stressors on depressive symptoms.."*

This quotation is from a Government website. In a broad sense it says that 'religion' can be good for you. But, is that all? I think it's fair to say that yoga, keep fit and a healthy diet is 'good' for us. And yet Scripture reminds us, "I have come that you may have life in all its fullness." At the moment we have problems in our world, our society and our churches. We have two options, firstly; pull up the draw bridge and put up the walls. But all this gives us is splendid isolation, Removed from the world and the church universal. One sees many churches in crisis do this or at least a variation of this. Non Christians commented in disbelief about these Christians who reached out in love to serve other.

This October we'll be looking at the end of the journey for the reorganisation of our parishes; some will be hurt and some may be angry and that is totally natural - And yet we must be people who; love and serve the community and the world. We cannot give up in our daily lives the action Jesus invites us - action like showing, Compassion, Care, Faithfulness, Service, charity, and I'm sure you could add to the list. In the coming days as the winter gets darker may we be a light to our parishes, communities and world. so what should we try to do

1. Pray daily for a realistic amount of time.
2. Read your bible
3. Never get cynical
4. Challenge your parish to ask, 'how can we serve the community.'
5. if you're feeling down, depressed or anxious then seek out help in your GPs surgery; in talking therapy and keep praying.

And please know that we (members of the church) pray for you everyday. God bless you and your loved ones.

## Community Speed Watch update from Helen Witty—helen.witty@gmail.com

I recently attended the annual Derbyshire Constabulary Community Speed Watch conference in my role as volunteer co-ordinator of Winster Community Speed Watch (CSW) group.

About 60 CSW groups were represented, and I wanted to share a little of what I learned.

Angelique Foster is our Derbyshire Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC). She is accountable to us, not to the Derbyshire Police. In that role she actively works to address the things that concern you most – and speeding is right up there.

Some villages have installed Speed Indicator Devices (SID) on their main thoroughfare. These are the lighted arrays you see at the side of the road that flash vehicle speed on approach – with encouragement to slow down if too fast. The speed of each car is recorded and passed back to the CSW co-ordinator or other nominated person.

The Hlland Ward co-ordinator brought along data from their SID - one car was recorded as doing **nearly 90 mph**. A check with the local constabulary confirmed it was **not** one of their vehicles on a blue light run. Where excessive speeding can be proved (such as this instance), the police can justify mounting a speed enforcement event, where offenders receive a speeding summons, fine and points. We as a volunteer group cannot do that—offenders receive warning letters and repeat offenders may have theirs personally delivered by the police but no other action is taken.

There is funding to buy a SID device from the PCC on application, with an appropriate contribution from the village. Approval of the highways and council authorities to place the SID on what is their property is also required.

I've approached the Parish Council about seeking a grant for at least one SID. I welcome your views on this as a prospect .

The Winster CSW has been out a number of times at the east end of the village near Wyntor Avenue, where visibility is sufficient to both see vehicles and record their speed with a speed gun. Unlike South Darley CSW, we

don't seem to record many who exceed the legally agreed 30mph + 10% + 3 mph i.e., 36mph. CSW are required to post signs to give notice we are out and about and maybe we are being too generous in where we place them. Even if we 'catch' nobody though, we have slowed them down coming into the village past the school which is a good thing.

Some residents on West Bank have expressed concerns about speeding on the bank. In order to set up a speed watch on the bank we need

- ☆ a safe publicly accessible place for CSW volunteers to stand – well back off the road but still able to see traffic coming towards the speed check
- ☆ two locations above and below the speed check for the warning signage – again off the road surface and clearly visible to drivers
- ☆ formal agreement from the local PCSO that we can meet these two requirements.

I think that these may be difficult to achieve but we can look at any ideas you may have for locations.

And finally..... a quick hope that anyone with an hour to spare in daylight hours might volunteer for Community Speed Watch. There is some simple training and a couple of forms to sign, and you are good to go. Please consider giving a small amount of your time; to keep you, your family and your pets safe when they are out and about. Again, email me if you wish to express your interest.

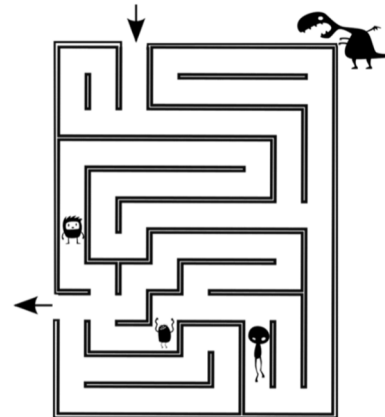

**“A Walk in the Parks’- Jen Lowthrop hiking 10 national parks in 10 weeks.**

In 1951, our beautiful Peak District became the first national park after fifty years of struggle by the ordinary people.

Nowadays we take a stroll down the Lathkill Dale, a quick lap around the Stanton Nine Ladies or use the pretty back roads to Bakewell without thinking.

A lot of us take living in the Peak District for granted.

We don't think about how every pathway we tread on costs money. About how more marginalised groups can't access the park and about how much money is needed to preserve and keep special the beautiful place we call home.

Now Birchover-born Jen Lowthrop is hiking more than 1,000 miles (1,609km) in 10 weeks across 10 national parks in aid of raising £10,000 pounds for our Peak District National Park Foundation.

This is a mammoth challenge for Jen and Cookie, her rescue dog who is accompanying her on the adventure aptly named 'A Walk in the Parks' even though it is anything but for digital consultant Jen.

Jen started the walk on Saturday, August 19 in Northumberland where she will then venture down south into the North York Moors, Yorkshire Dales, Lake District, South Downs, New Forest, Dartmoor, and Exmoor as well as completing a stint by canoe in the Norfolk Broads before a final leg back into the Peaks, October 20-28.

This endeavour is more than just walking. Jen will be meeting key people along the way in each region to learn more about what makes each national park special and why they need to be protected, and documenting these conversations via her travel blog She Gets Around.

The walk is self-funded by Jen, who has taken 10 weeks out of her job to raise money for this cause close to her heart.

Alpkit have also promised to match fund her £10,000 but only if she raises her £10,000 aim. They plan to give a further £1,000 to each national park to fund vital projects, but Jen's still a long way off that total and needs the support.

If you love the Peak District, give back by supporting her challenge.



Every penny will go towards projects promoting accessibility and wellbeing for visitors from all backgrounds to enjoy the park, projects caring for the landscape and wildlife and projects tackling climate change impacting the park we love.

### **Don't rush to "go digital" on your phone line**

At some point in the next few months, Winsters telephone exchange is set for a change of technology. The East Midlands is one of the first areas to change over—and when the change comes, we may only get a few weeks' notice.

After the change, those with a broadband router will need to connect corded and cordless phones via their router—most have a phone socket hidden behind a sticker. Those without broadband should be given a special box (which is actually a simple router) and their current phones should work with this.

But there is a snag. At the moment, corded phones on landlines will carry on working in a power cut— Winsters exchange has batteries (and perhaps a generator) that will keep things running even when your house has no electricity. But that will change. Once the change happens, the moment your power goes off (either because the whole village is off, or because a fire or flood has tripped your fuse box), then off will go your "landline" phones. And off will go your "Wifi calling" if you use it.

If you have a usable mobile signal (and a charged-up phone) then you will be able to reach 999 services using your mobile. But otherwise you will need a Battery Backup Unit if you want to be able to make any sort of voice call during a power cut.

Ofcom, the telecoms regulator, have set rules that say that telecoms providers should give you a Battery Backup Unit if you are registered as "vulnerable" or if you don't have a usable mobile signal. But none of the phone companies actually seems to be doing this yet.

So, if you get a letter telling you that your line is going to get changed, and if you don't have a usable mobile signal throughout your house, my advice is to follow the instructions for telling your supplier that you are in an "at risk" category, and ask not to be changed over yet. In due course, the companies will have to get their act together and offer backup units without a fuss. But they aren't doing that yet, so it will pay to delay if you can.

I've heard of some people being told that they have to take immediate action to avoid losing their phone number. That isn't right— and if you do get someone worrying you like this, do get in touch and I can check things out for you.
