The Vicar's Letter

August Thought

“Those who are Baptised are called to worship and serve God... to continue in the teaching of the Apostles and the Breaking of the bread.. to proclaim by word and example the Good News in Christ... serving God in all people and loving your neighbour as yourself.”

This is part of the ‘Sending out’ of the newly Baptised. All Christian Churches acknowledge the person who is Baptised in the Name of the Trinity. Baptism is a one off event. A one off outpouring of the Grace of the Holy Spirit into our lives. Yet, we always have to remember that this Amazing Grace isn't magic. Like a person who is bed-bound loses their muscle mass, those who don't Worship God and serve other people with great generosity and joy lose some of their ‘spiritual’ muscle mass. Even more, the less we celebrate what it means to be a Christian we become cold and barren. An image of this effect is the story by Oscar Wilde called the ‘Selfish Giant’. The coldness of the Giant's heart had a life denying effect on the home and garden where he lived.

It's a terrible thing for people to meet a Christian who is cynical and joyless, or even worse miserable. Many who suffer much still seem to have a deep joy which neither their illness nor condition nor circumstance steals from them. Do we allow things to steal our peace? Do we allow conditions to rob us of our joy and happiness and love of serving other people?

Two universal truths: ‘Life is Hard’ and yet ‘We are loved by God’

So as Christians we acknowledge the challenges of this world and endeavour to make our world better, even in small ways. Let us think each day of how we can improve life for others near and far. However great life's challenges are, God's love, grace and forgiveness are far greater. So maybe in this month of August we can ask ourselves two questions:

‘How can we receive the peace and joy of Christ?’ and ‘How do we serve people in very serious needs in our community?’

I have to say after nearly every funeral I've taken there is always a sense of the person living the best they can for their loved ones but often also for our communities. Some showed love in quiet ways and some in very obvious ways. All of us can make a difference. I finish now with the final part of the sending out from the Baptism Service. “May Christ dwell in your hearts through faith; that you may be rooted and grounded in love and bring forth the fruit of the Spirit.” God bless you in your goodness.

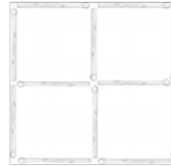

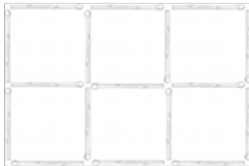
