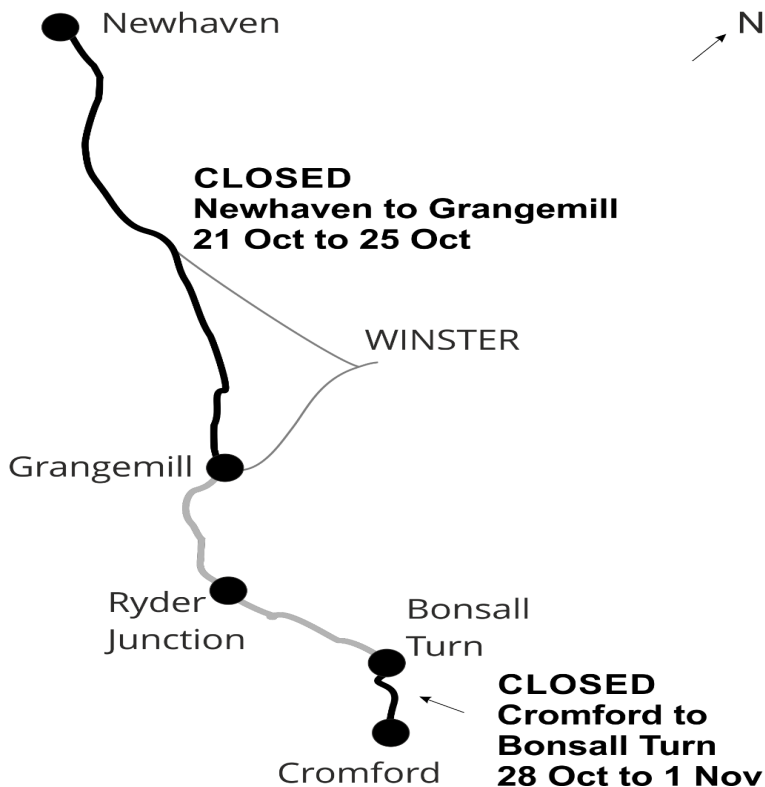

Via Gellia road works information

For the next few weeks, there will be disruptions on the Via Gellia. Closures will take place in phases, between Cromford and Newhaven. The map on the facing page is the currently understood schedule and is subject to change. The work includes tidying of road edges and white lining, and the installation of 10 new 'average speed' cameras. Speed limits will also be dropped by 10 mph on various stretches. These are all measures to improve the safety on what is one of the 50 most dangerous roads in England.

Planned Road Closure

The B5057 is scheduled to be closed between Winster and Darley Bridge overnight on three dates: Wed 30 October, Thu 31 October and Fri 1 November - closing at 1900 each day and reopening at 0700 the following morning. The promise is that access to properties in the affected section will be maintained, whenever reasonably possible. There

is also a note that road might re-open early if the work is finished ahead of schedule. The closure is to allow Gigaclear to pull in their "back-haul" fibre optic cable that will connect their hub in Winster to the outside world.

Love in a Box – Christmas Shoebboxes

The Samaritans Purse organises the delivery of donated boxes of gifts to children in some of the world's poorest areas.

Below are two accounts from them about the amazing effect the shoe boxes can have on children.

'Two friends cried for joy when they opened their shoebox gifts and saw lots of school supplies. They had been praying that God would provide these items, since their families couldn't afford to buy them. Their parents thanked God, and prayed with the team in the Philippines who had organised the outreach

event.'

'In eastern Europe, a young boy had also been longing for specific items—a football and football shirt. When he opened his shoebox gift, he started jumping for joy because his box contained, among many special things, those exact items.'

Amazing!! If you would like to take part in this, leaflets with information on how to pack the boxes, with suggestions of what to pack, a list of what NOT to pack, will be available in Winster Shop from the beginning of November. You can use a shoe box or else pick up a flat pack box from the shop. The filled boxes need to be returned to the shop by the **11th Nov** so I can take them to the drop off centre in Chesterfield. Remembrance Letter for November 2024

“Lest We Forget”

“O God, you love justice and you establish peace on earth. We bring before you the disunity of today’s world: the absurd violence, and the many wars which are breaking the courage of the peoples of the world; militarism and the armaments race, which are threatening life on the planet; human greed and injustice, which breed hatred and strife. Send your Spirit and renew the face of the earth. Teach us to be compassionate toward the whole human family; strengthen the will of all those who fight for justice and for peace; lead all nations into the path of peace, and give us that peace which the world cannot give. Amen.” [A Prayer from Zaire, BCW, 797-98]

November is a month of memories, it is a mixture of nostalgia, blessings, family stories, and maybe pain, loss and sorrow. As a priest I’ve spent much time with people living in the ‘Autumn’ of their lives. Often people in this chapter of their lives look back with regret and with wishful longing. But equally, it can be where we ask the question; ‘Where was God in all these chapters of their lives?’ Sometimes with God’s grace we are able to look at the positive and negative of our lives and see that God’s never left us. Even in the darkest Days, God leads us on. In the Christian life we are often encouraged to reflect on the day before going to sleep. It consists of:

Where have I sinned today?

Where have I being kind, loving etc?

Where has God blessed me?

Where have I failed?

And we say a prayer of sorrow, of regret and of thanksgiving etc. Then we are called to draw a line under the day. This is an ancient way of prayer and I’d really recommend it. It’s also good for ones mental health as well as ones spiritual health.

In church we do much of this in our Services. We remember the people who have died in our communities; we remember those who have died in wars and conflicts. We end the churches year looking back and then we look forward to the future all in the Grace of God. We are blessed by our times of faithfulness, and we ask forgiveness for our brokenness. No church is perfect and no church member is perfect. As a priest I’m very conscious of my sins and failings. But you and God are very faithful in your patience and forgiveness. In Autumn we remember all our changes and movement towards God. In Derbyshire we are very lucky for the season of the year show us the journey of life in 12 months. Autumn and Winter; always leads to Spring and Summer. In the Christian life we know God never leaves us nor forsakes us. As you remember so many things this November even the most painful – please know that you are deeply loved by God. In the greatest of changes in life we remember that God makes us all a promise He, “Abides with Me” Finally, God never changes His love never stops for all of us. We are all held in the love of God.

From the beginning of our lives to their earthly conclusion. God bless you all and please feel free to join us as we remember the Military on the 10th November (and in the afternoon in the Whitworth park) and on the 3rd of November at St Helen's Church, Darley Dale. we remember all our loved ones who have died in the past few

years (or longer) Be assured of my love and prayers.
