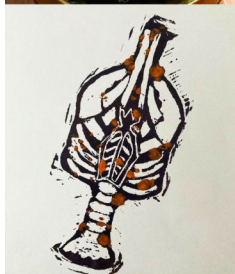

Mosquito Prevention advice from Lyria Jones

Mosquitoes breed on water and your water butt is their ideal location.

The larvae hang from the surface, held there by surface tension, with their breathing tubes just above the water level. A few drops of washing up liquid - just 3 or 4 - dropped into your water butt will reduce the surface tension so the larvae cant hang there, they drop down and drown! This needs doing only every month or so during the summer breeding season, and such a small amount of detergent will not affect the water for the garden.

District Council strategy for new homes to protect the Dales distinctive rural character

Derbyshire Dales District Council has set out a plan for how the area should grow in the future, including where new homes and workplaces could be built. The updated Local Plan explains how the District Council aims to meet Government targets for housing in the Dales, which have more than doubled since the current Plan was published in 2017, while still protecting the special character of the landscape and local communities.

Communities will be invited to share their views on the new Derbyshire Dales Local Plan, and these will be considered by the Planning Inspector before a final decision is made. Comments must be submitted through the official 'Regulation 19' consultation, which is due to start in August 2026. Any comments sent outside this process cannot be considered. As a first step, anyone who wants to take part should sign up using the District Council's online form so they can be notified when the consultation starts.

The District Council is not currently meeting the increased national targets for housing. This has led to a number of planning appeals being lost, meaning that development can go ahead in places the District Council may not have chosen. By approving an updated Local Plan with clear policies, the District Council can reset the housing targets and regain control over where new homes are built in the future, helping ensure development happens in appropriate locations. For the

Plan to be accepted by Government, the District Council is expected to leave 'no stone unturned' to identify enough suitable sites.

Proposed sites for new homes focus on the market towns of Ashbourne, Matlock and Wirksworth, along with limited new housing in Darley Dale and the villages of Brailsford, Doveridge, Hulland Ward, Middleton-by-Wirksworth and Tansley. Smaller scale development may take place in smaller villages, where it can be demonstrated that this would help meet local housing needs.

The draft plan also identifies a site south of Ashbourne as the potential location for a new settlement. Although currently an indicative allocation, it is intended to develop plans for a new settlement in due course. This could eventually have around 2,000-4,000 new homes along with appropriate facilities such as a primary school, health facilities, small scale employment and local shops. Such a new settlement could reduce the need for new housing elsewhere in the district, thus helping to preserve the character of the Derbyshire Dales.

Overall, the plan aims to strike a balance between places for people to live and places to work, in a way that is sustainable for the future. The supporting policies will help deliver the Council's commitment to healthy, thriving and sustainable communities. They will also address climate change, promote high-quality development, strengthen green infrastructure, and protect the district's varied landscapes.

The District Council is due to vote on the Local Plan in July 2026. After that, a six-week consultation period will allow communities to have their voices heard by the Planning Inspector, who will make the decision about whether to accept the new Derbyshire Dales Local Plan.

I hope that you have all noticed the triptych of The Guisers on the stairwell in the Burton Institute. If you haven't, then you should! Here is the story of how it came about.

A couple of Christmases ago, we invited some friends to join us at the carol concert in our beautiful St John's church. We knew that the Guisers would be joining us but we didn't tell our friends because we wanted them to have the same experience as we had when we first came to the village! Our friend, Paul Thorne, is an artist who lives in Middleton and here is what he had to say:

On a cold winter's evening, I walked to the church to hear the choir welcome in the joy of Christmas. As I listened to the carols, I was reflecting on the year gone by when my musings were interrupted by a loud banging on the church door.

To my surprise, a group of very unusual looking travellers entered the church shouting about good and evil, brave and strong. I couldn't tell if these people were men or women because they were all in the strangest of disguises.

At first, I really did not know what to think but, as their story unfolded, my artistic imagination started to form a painting and by the time the group departed, I knew how the painting would look and this is what you will see today and for many years to come. A painting should make you think and I hope that the triptych does just that.

I have been an artist all my life. It is a gift from God: the greatest of all creators.

The Vicar's July Message

I'm not sure who came up with the idea that peace in Christianity is more than "the absence of conflict." But this is so evidently true in our world today. The concept often translated as "peace" in the Bible carries a sense of wholeness, reconciliation, and right relationship—with God, with other people, and within oneself. As Christians we cannot simply shut ourselves off from the world. Jesus calls us to do the opposite. That's hard because the biggest battle for a Christian is the lack of peace we feel within ourselves. That's why a central theme of Christian teaching is that peace originates in God. In the New Testament, Jesus Christ tells his followers, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you." This peace is presented not as something dependent on circumstances, but as an inner confidence rooted in faith and trust.

Christianity also connects peace with forgiveness. The teachings of Christ encourage believers to forgive others, love their enemies, and seek reconciliation rather than revenge. These principles challenge people to respond to hostility with compassion and understanding, aiming to break cycles of resentment and violence. Some people think this is a 'soft' option but working for peace is always very costly.

I know I'm repeating myself but Peace has both personal and social dimensions. Personally, it involves spiritual peace—a sense of being reconciled with God and living according to one's conscience. Socially, it calls Christians to be "peacemakers," working for justice, mercy, and the well-being of others. Peace is not viewed as a passive acceptance of wrongdoing; rather, it often involves actively working against injustice while maintaining respect for all human dignity.

Throughout history, we have people who can inspire us by their lives and teachings promoting non-violence and reconciliation. Figures such as Francis of Assisi, Desmond Tutu, and Martin Luther King Jr. emphasized peace rooted in love, forgiveness, and justice. The following thought sums it up well.

"Ultimately, Christianity presents peace as both a gift and a responsibility: a gift received through faith and a responsibility expressed through acts of kindness, reconciliation, and service. In this view, peace grows when individuals seek to reflect God's love in their relationships and communities, contributing to a more compassionate and harmonious world."

Please Welcome (drum roll) !- New Photocopier at the Burton Institute

Our old Konica Minolta copier had reached the end of its life after nine years and half a million copies, and we have replaced this with a new Ricoh copier.

The machine is pretty similar to the previous one: it will print single or double sided on A4 or A3 - from originals (as a copier) or (as a printer) from a USB memory stick. And it will scan single- or double-sided documents (up to A3) onto a memory stick.

It will also print direct from a laptop, although this takes a bit of setting up: get in touch if you need this.

Existing users should find that their existing code works for the new machine. There are some basic instructions on the wall next to the machine.

If you are not an existing user, you are very welcome to become one. I need a £5 deposit, and will give you a lock code for the door, and a user code for the machine, in return. Then we will charge your usage (6p per side black-and-white, 9p per side for colour) against that payment until it is nearly used up, at which point we will ask you to top up.

The new copier has been funded by a tremendously generous anonymous donation. We managed to buy the machine for considerably less than we had expected (thanks to a Public Sector purchasing consortium scheme) and the excess funds will be used for other improvements at the Institute. Our sincere thanks to the donor(s), whoever you are.
