Dales people urged to get behind Women's Tour

Derbyshire Dales District Council is getting behind the Aviva Women's Tour when it hits the area on **Friday 17 June** with support and funding being made available for community activities.

The council provided similar support for last September's Tour of Britain and is building on the success of that event as the world's top women racers take on the Dales. To encourage communities to get involved along the route small grants of up to £100 are available with an application form online at www.derbyshiredales.gov.uk/womenstour

Stage Three of the Women's Tour - from Ashbourne to Chesterfield - is being billed as the toughest stage of the race, featuring Chatsworth, Youlgrave and Matlock. Two 'Queen of the Mountains' sections at Alport and Matlock's Bank Road will add extra excitement and drama.

Dales towns and villages that will see Stage 3 at first hand are Ashbourne (10.45am start), Earl Sterndale, Flagg, Monyash, Youlgrave, **Winster**, Wensley, South Darley, Darley Bridge, Darley Dale, Matlock, Beeley and Baslow.

The race will also speed by close to the villages of Fenny Bentley, Tissington, Biggin, Heathcote, Hartington, Chelmorton, Alport, Stanton in Peak, Birchover, Elton, Edensor and Pilsley, eventually leaving the Dales to travel through Buxton and on to Chesterfield.

The stage also falls on the same weekend as the popular Eroica Britannia family festival in Bakewell, just a short ride from the Stage Three route.

Chairman of the District Council's Community & Environment Committee Councillor Jo Wild said: "It was fabulous to see community groups and partnership organisations get behind the Tour of Britain last autumn and we want to make 17 June another day to remember both for the competitors and local people across the Derbyshire Dales."

DID YOU KNOW.....?

We hope you enjoy thinking about our big questions as much as we do.

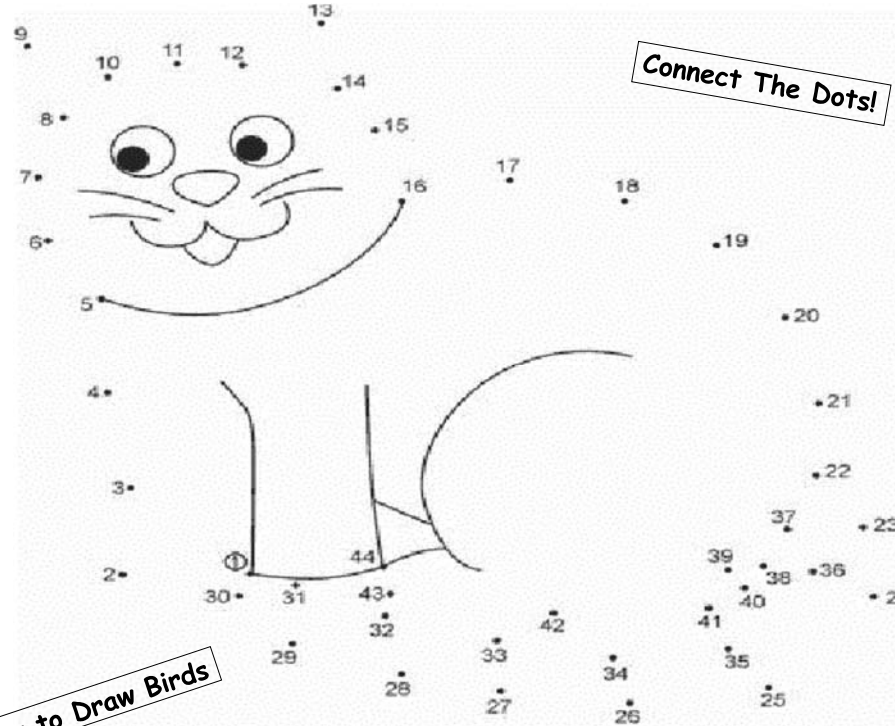

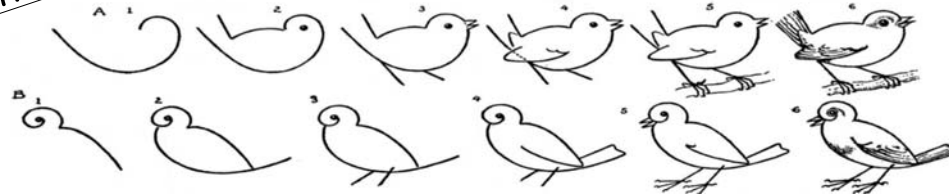

EARTHQUAKE VILLAGE

They think it's great fun to live there

HOW would you like to live in "Earthquake Village"—where the school desks shake and shudder and the ground goes—"BOOM"? Barbara Longden and Leon Stone, both aged ten, think it's fun.

They live at Winster, near Matlock in Derbyshire, with 120 other children in the village of tumbling chimneys and creaking floors. Barbara and Leon—they sit next to each other in school—are growing up in one of the strangest places in Britain.

For 100 years the ground under Winster (population 700) has startled the villagers by going "bang-boom," so that all the children say is: "There's another bit of Winster falling down."

Barbara and Leon collect "rumbies." For two miles down, say the geologists, there is a "fault" in the earth's strata.

Old shafts

The village, 1,000ft. above sea-level, lies wedged between the steep Derbyshire hills. Old mine shafts have riddled the hillsides.

Under the houses, say the cave explorers, lie great caverns so huge you could build a church in them.

Through these a river flows in darkness.

Barbara and Leon last heard the "booms" or earth tremors quite recently.

But they can remember 1952—when a "baby earthquake" shook the village 10 times in two months, knocked off five chimneys, bounced a stone cross from the church roof, and made people jump five miles away.

Tells pupils

It is all recorded in a "log-book" kept by the head master, Mr. George Noton. He tells his pupils exactly what is going on deep down below.

He explains that underground there is "a well-known geological fault-belt where a layer of soft stone is squeezed and crushed by the harder rocks above."

But — and everyone in Winster knows—there is no danger. So it really is fun to live in a place where you can say: "Earthquakes? Oh yes . . . we've had lots of them. . . ."

Are you interested in a new flat?

Locally based Peak District Rural Housing Association is working with Winster Parish Council to provide **four two bedroomed flats in Winster for local people**. They would like to hear from anyone who is interested in renting a flat. If you are interested, please **fill in the form enclosed with the magazine** and return it to them or contact them by phone on **0300 1234 009**.

In 2012 a housing need survey of Winster was carried out by the District Council. This showed that there are a number of people needing accommodation. They were mostly single people or couples. The association is checking that the need remains and would like to hear from you **by 10th June** if possible.

The Parish Council and the association has identified some land close to Florence Gladwin Close, which will take the four flats and is now preparing a planning application. The flats will each have two bedrooms. They will be rented to people who have a long standing connection to Winster or an immediately surrounding parish.

The association specialises in building homes for local people in the Peak District, for example, they built Alice's Cottages in Elton and Hannah Bowman Way in Youlgrave. Alison Clamp from the association reported on progress to the Parish Council at their meeting in May and will keep them updated on progress. Building work on the flats is expected to start late this year with completion in summer 2017.

Delivery of new waste collections sacks

During May, Winster residents will be getting a delivery of free food caddy liners from Derbyshire Dales District Council. Deliveries are underway to all 34,000 homes across the Dales and are being undertaken by a dedicated team - not bin emptying crews. Properties that use black sacks for household waste collections will also receive a free roll of sacks during May. The same applies to residents who have subscribed to the council's compostable scheme for garden waste. Anyone who currently uses black sacks for household waste and hasn't yet subscribed to the compostable sacks scheme for garden waste can complete the online form at www.derbyshiredales.gov.uk/waste or call the Helpline number above.

I would like to advise residents that if they haven't received their year's supply of caddy liners/black sacks/compostable garden sacks by the end of May, they should email waste@derbyshiredales.gov.uk or contact the District Council's Waste Helpline on 01629 761122 **before 30 June**.

Local Projects Fund

Vicar's Letter for May

A Thought.

An amazing statistic I heard today (3rd May) on the radio is: Manchester United have paid more on players in the last 10 years than Leicester City spent on players since their foundation!! Yet that group of 'cheap' simple players together have won the Premier League.

At the beginning of the season they were 5000:1 (I wish I'd put a bet on!!) This is both a cause for great celebrating and also a challenge to us in our daily lives.
