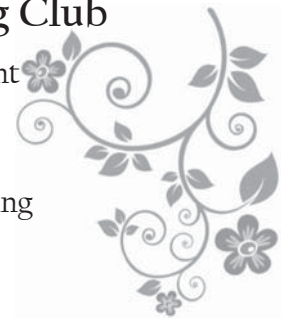

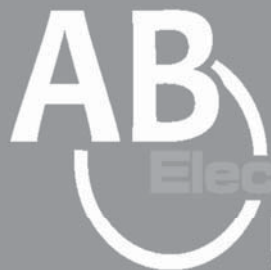

The magazine is a non-sectarian publication.

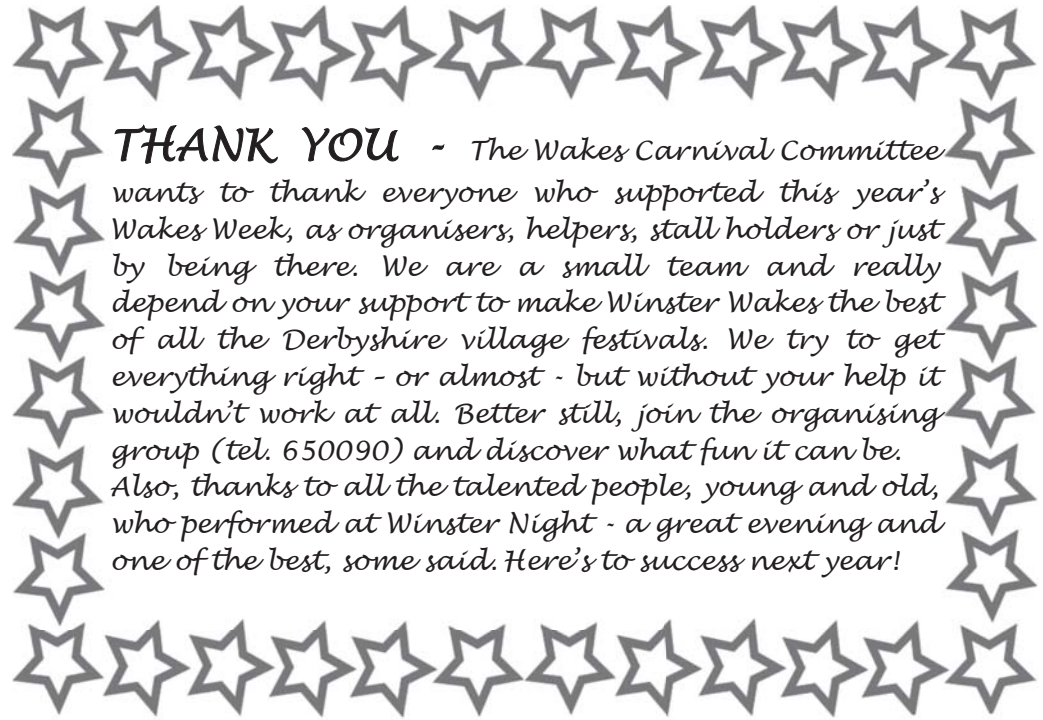

This was a brilliant event with a wonderful atmosphere and something that inspired us all to pursue our music and keep practising!

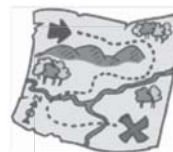

AND NOW IN COLOUR

After 11 years and ½ million copies, the Winster photocopier at the Burton Institute has reached the end of its life.

Having a copier in the village is a great facility: it means that we can produce the Village Mag quickly and cheaply, and it also allows individuals and organisations in the village to save time and petrol by being able to copy and print here in Winster. Over the years, user charges have more than covered the cost of purchase.

So the Burton Institute has bought a brand new copier, which does everything that the old one did (printing up to A3 size, single or double sided), and more too.

As well as copying (now in colour too), the new machine will print PDF or JPG files straight from a USB memory stick, or (by arrangement) you can print from a laptop.

And there's no more need to write down how many copies you have made - each user will have their own ID code, with the machine automatically counting how many copies each user has made.

Users pay an initial £5 deposit, and are then billed for usage every few months in arrears. Black-and-white copies (A4 or A3) will be 6p per side, and colour copies (A4 or A3) will be 9p per side - which is almost certainly less than it would cost you in ink.
