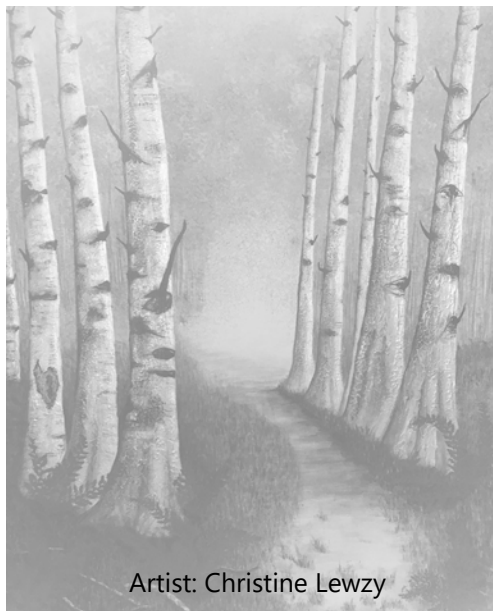

Recipe Corner — BBQ time — Salad Cream!!

Winster folk : Please share your favourite recipes & local dishes, home crops, home made goodies, brews & preserves - don't be shy!



June is our final collaboration for now with the **Foods of England Project**. Who can resist eating outside on a warm summer's evening? BBQ ablaze, a chilled beer and a delicious seasonal salad. To dress up your greenery and provide a tasty dip for grills and kebabs why not try homemade salad cream? It's quintessentially English and has been around for hundreds of years - who knew?! This is from Eliza Acton's 'Modern Cookery for Private Families'. Full of flavour, super easy to make in a food processor - forget beating with ye olde wooden spoon. It's NOTHING like the sickly bottled variety.

Ingredients & method.

Hard-boil 4 eggs, thoroughly chill, then scoop out yolks. Add yolks to the food processor with half tsp salt, 1 tsp sugar, pinch cayenne, twist black pepper, pea size piece crushed garlic, half tsp dried chilli, 1/4 tsp Dijon mustard then pulse to a fine crumb. Measure out EITHER 1/4 pint cream & 1 tsp cold water OR 6 tbsp olive oil. Run the processor and gradually add cream or oil. Measure 3 tbsp white wine vinegar, run the processor and gradually add in 2 tbsp, then very slowly drizzle in any further vinegar required until the sauce has a custard consistency - may need up to 3 tbsp. Keeps in the fridge for up to 3 days. You can find ingredients in Winster shop.

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Councillor's Corner

I want to say a big thank you to everybody who voted for me in the recent local elections. For those of you who have not yet seen the results for the Winster and South Darley Ward, it was as follows...

Charlie Foster Philips (Labour) 22 votes (3%)

Colin Swindell (Independent) 758 votes (97%)

Turnout for 57.6% - the highest for any ward across the district

The vote I received was far greater than anything I imagined. I was overwhelmed when I saw the number of ballot papers being counted and very grateful for the trust that residents have put in me. I want to thank everybody who took the time to vote and to those people who supported me through leafleting, putting up posters, garden boards and spreading messages of support. I couldn't have done it without you and I will continue to work tirelessly and represent you to the best of my ability.

Now that the elections are over, its back to work and getting on with the job. Throughout the campaign a lot of problems, concerns and issues were raised with me. I have already begun the work of addressing these. If you raised an issue of concern with me, I will be in touch with you in the coming weeks to update you.

With the controlling conservative groups majority reduced to just one councillor I hope that the new council will adopt a more cooperative approach where there is cross-party consensus to tackle the challenges we face and opposition councillors are listened to more.

I will uphold my promise of not siding with any party and will not join any voting block or coalition. I will vote, for or against, items on a case by case basis. I will only support policies, ideas and services that benefit my constituents, our communities and the wider Derbyshire Dales.

Overall Summary of the Derbyshire Dales Results

Overall across the Derbyshire Dales, the Conservative group have retained control of Derbyshire Dales District Council with a reduced majority - they now have a majority of 1 down from 9.

The Liberal Democrats take over from Labour as the official opposition. The Lib Dems gained 5 new councillors on their 2015 return and Labour have gained one. The Greens were winners too, taking two seats, and the voters also returned 3 Independent councillors. It means the Conservatives hold control by a single seat, taking 20 of the available 39 seats.

The last result of the Count at Wirksworth Leisure Centre was declared at 4.45am - a single vote victory for the Green Party candidate Matthew Buckler in Stanton.

So the final result was:

- Conservatives 20 seats
- Lib Dems 8
- Labour 6
- Independents 3
- Green Party 2

The overall Derbyshire Dales turnout was 41.6%.

Winster: Children's Poems by Charles Causley set to Music by Jim Causley

Many people will know the work of the late famous and much-loved Cornish poet Charles Causley (of Timothy Winters fame). His relative Jim Causley is a widely-respected folk musician, who brings to Winster his settings of Charles's poems, along with anecdotes and information from the family archive, to which he has unique access.

The result is a marvellous show, combining the beauty and humour of the poems with the top-class musicianship of Jim and fascinating insights into the life and beliefs of the poet himself. Support is provided by two other fine musicians, Derbyshire's own Keith Kendrick and Sylvia Needham.

Jim is a multi-instrumentalist with a beautiful bass voice and an easy stage manner. The Guardian says he has 'a natural gift for entertainment' and he creates an immediate rapport with the audience. He has been nominated no fewer than six times as Singer of the Year in the BBC Radio 2 Folk Awards.

Geoff Lester of Winster Entertainments Group said: 'I saw this show in Whitby Folk Week last year and booked it without hesitation. The queue for the CD stretched right round the theatre.'

St. John The Baptist Church Winster

I am struck by how sharing our weakness and difficulties is more nourishing to others than sharing our qualities and successes. Jean Vanier

When I left school I worked in a nursing home with people with various mental and emotional needs. It didn't take too long to realise that when working with vulnerable people I received more than I gave. I was given trust and acceptance and I was allowed to help someone else. I was taught that speed and productivity are not always the most important things in life. Taking lots of time to produce a meal, or tidy up in the garden or in the home, were tools which did something practical, but also build up relationships. Jean Vanier was from a super privileged family, he had an amazing intellect and passion for learning. His father was a very important diplomat in Canada. Jean was always a person of faith, but when visiting Paris, he realised that he wanted to help people on the periphery of society. He met two men who were in a large mental asylum which was sadly just a factory for broken souls. It didn't try to help people, but it simply kept people away from those who were considered 'normal'. Jean built up communities where carers and people with various needs all lived together. These became known as L'Arche communities. There are hundreds throughout the world. Though they are inspired by faith, everyone is welcome both as a core member and also as a helper. For Jean, community and relationship was vital to help people grow. Jean also served in World War II in the Royal Navy and saw humanity at its very worst and also saw acts of great love and bravery. He believed humanity could, with the grace of God, serve all people. Jean died last week at the age of 90 (7th May). How can we build up our community in love, hope, joy and fellowship? Jean said the following: *Community is a sign that love is possible in a materialistic world where people so often either ignore or fight each other. It is a sign that we don't need a lot of money to be happy - in fact, the opposite.* "Our mission - said Jean Vanier in an interview with Vatican Radio - is to encounter a world of extreme weakness, poverty and suffering, people who have often been rejected... L'Arche is a place of reconciliation where people of very different religions and cultures can meet and this transforms the lives of people with disabilities, but also transforms the volunteers. L'Arche, after all, is a place of celebration where the aim is for everyone to be happy (...) We want to be a sign of the importance of people with disabilities, because they have a message to give, but few know it: they, in fact, were chosen to be the great witnesses of God." People with disabilities lead us to God. (...) If you become a man or a woman of compassion, you will be like Jesus."

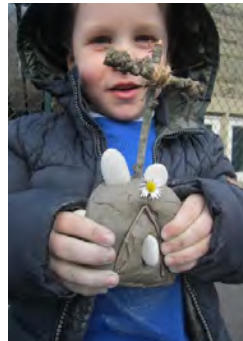
