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Burton Institute Charges

Having held prices level since 2016, the Burton Institute Management Committee have decided that we need to increase our prices from 1st January 2020. The increase, which averages 5%, will see Winster organisations paying £11.50 per session to use the Jubilee Room. For the Main Hall, the Higher Rate for community groups (for meals, teas, performances and events for more than 30 people requiring membership or making a charge) will be £27 and the Standard Rate (for all other voluntary organisation use) will be £15.75. Children's parties will cost £27.25 and private functions will cost £76. There is a new rate for post-funeral receptions, which will be charged at £38.

RECIPE CORNER – SEVERED FINGER BISCUITS



Heat oven to 180 degrees or GM4. Marinade fingernails - flaked or whole almonds - in a few drops of red gel food colouring. Make biscuit dough : Blend together 250g butter, one egg yolk, 2 tsp vanilla essence , 140g sugar. Add 300g sifted plain flour and knead together. (Or you can just use a packet cookie mix!) Chill for 30 mins. Roll out biscuit mixture into thin finger length sausages—the dough spreads. Use the back of a knife to draw knuckle like lines, press bloodied nail into position. Bake until golden (about 10-12 mins) on baking parchment. When cooled, warm a teaspoon of jam with a few drops of red gel food colouring, dip severed end of finger into jam for a clotted blood appearance, splatter a few drops of jammy blood artistically on the serving platter. Pictured here with a few smarties mixed in to the dough for a slightly decomposed effect - Spooktacularly gross! Kids will love 'em. Happy Hallowe'en baking! All ingredients can be found in the village shop.

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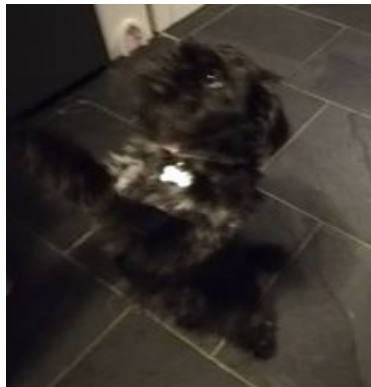
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PET OF THE MONTH:

Still Waiting by Geoff Dalton

My dad gave me a book for my seventh birthday. It was called The Children's Wonders of the World Encyclopaedia - or something like that. I remember it had a soft, dark blue cover and contained a whole load of stuff from pond life to dinosaurs. It was printed in black and white on slightly glossy paper and smelt very grown up. There were nice illustrations of modern wonders: refrigerators, radio valves, that kind of thing. Printed inside the front and back covers in a pale blue monochrome, were drawings of plants and animals and strange-looking people from around the globe. There were pyramids, airships, steam locomotives.... There was also a poem by Rudyard Kipling.

*I keep six honest serving men
(They taught me all I knew)
Their names are What and Why and When
And How and Where and Who*

My book was not so large that it couldn't be carried to school. Pamela Webb kept her own copy at home. Pamela's best friend was Valerie Avis. Valerie had a real leather satchel and long black hair tied in a ponytail. I considered her to be the most heavenly creature ever to grace the playground of the James Elliman County Primary School. I never made much headway with Valerie, probably because I carried round a book that included the word Encyclopaedia.

Included as a Wonder of the World was a chapter about the human body. This was my favourite. One idea, nicely illustrated, was that if you took a human being apart molecule by molecule, atom by atom (an advanced concept at the time), you would finish up with no more or no less than the carbon you might find in a bucket of coal, enough water to fill up a small barrel, fat to make up a few blocks of lard, calcium in a box of blackboard chalks, iron in a bag of six-inch nails, sulphur from a box of matches and so on. The author of this particular piece had calculated that at 1949 prices, a human was worth one-and-eleven-pence-halfpenny, less I supposed for children. I made a silly mistake of suggesting that the whole of the Avis family would come in at about nine or ten bob. This proposition was not appealing to Valerie, especially as her dad was something big in the motor trade.

Seventy years later, I'm still pondering how a hotchpotch of inanimate objects could be assembled to make it possible for someone like old Geoff to tell the difference between my heart's desire and a bucket of coal or a block of lard.

I'm still waiting for Kipling's serving men to come up with an answer to that one.
