Festive Pheasant Wellington

Is the thought of cooking a traditional Christmas dinner filling you with dread? Don't fancy the turkey curry leftovers, or a small household? This could be the recipe for you! Featuring local pheasant shot in Lathkill Dale, this dish feels special but is pretty simple to cook. **All meat in this recipe can be ordered from E.W Coates the Butchers via Winsters village shop. Or pop into the butchers at 11 Dale**

Road North, Darley Dale DE4 2HX (733639), or Chesterfield Road, Two Dales DE4 2EZ (733504) where the friendly staff will be pleased to offer help and advice on all aspects of their produce.

Use ready rolled puff pastry. Can prep the day before: **Mushroom pate:** Finely chop (or pulse in food processor) 4 shallots, 250g mushrooms, 2 cloves crushed garlic—sauté for 15 mins in a spray of olive oil. Add tsp brandy, 1 tbsp cream from a 150 ml carton, simmer for further 5 mins until mixture is quite dry. Refrigerate for 1 hr +. **Pheasant:** select 2 good size breasts, slit each and add a few fresh thyme leaves to centre and reseal. To ensure moist succulent meat, lightly butter the outside then completely wrap with streaky bacon (rind removed and saved). Refrigerate for 1 hr +

Assembly and cooking: Preheat oven to 220 (200 fan) degrees. Spray large frying pan with oil. On med/high heat cook pheasant a couple mins per side to colour bacon, decrease heat to very low and cook for 5 mins either side, then turn heat off and leave to rest for 5 mins. Cut puff pastry to approx. A4 size, place onto a floured sheet of cling film. Spread 1/4 mushroom pate in the centre the size of pheasant breast, place meat on top then add 1/4 pate to cover the top of the meat. Use the clingfilm to roll the Wellington neatly and seal the top and side of the pasty case with water. Decorate with pastry leaves and add a knife slot to vent. Place Wellingtons onto baking parchment on a metal tray and cook up to 20 mins until golden brown. Leave to rest for up to 10 mins before serving. You can use the chopped bacon rinds to roast sprouts at the same time. Use the pan and meat juice to sauté a clove crushed garlic, add remainder carton cream, 2 tbsp water, tsp brandy, zest small orange, salt & pepper until thickened—about 5 mins. **P.S. if you are going to go for the traditional turkey dinner after all, don't forget to place your Christmas meat orders to avoid disappointment!**

Councillor's Corner

Christmas bin collections

This year, Christmas and New Year's Day fall on a Wednesday – which is the usual collection day for Winster. Because of this, there will be significant changes to the day your bins will be emptied during the Christmas period.

The Wednesday collection scheduled for Christmas Day will take place earlier on Saturday 21 December. The Wednesday collection scheduled for New Year's Day will take place later on Thursday 2 January.

- Garden waste collections will be suspended from 21 Dec to 4 Jan inclusive.
- Food waste will still be collected weekly over the Christmas period on the collection dates outlined above.
- REAL Christmas trees will be collected from the edge of your property between Monday 6 January and Friday 31 January on the same day your garden waste is collected. Please make sure the tree is cut down to at least 5ft in height and all decorations are removed!
- Non-glitter cards and wrapping paper can be left in your blue bin insert or blue bag.
- Crews WILL NOT collect any additional household waste. Please make sure all household waste is contained in your grey bin or 4 black standard sized sacks on collection day.
- Crews WILL take excess recycling. Simply place extra materials at the side of your recycling containers, make sure it is easily identifiable as recycling materials.

Free Parking throughout December

Derbyshire Dales District Council is once again providing free parking everyday throughout December from 2pm. This is on top of the free parking provided through your residents parking permit which allows free parking up to 11am and after 4pm.

The scheme starts on 1 December and is available on all Derbyshire Dales car parks throughout the District. Please make sure that the car park is operated by the District Council by looking for the Council's logo on the pay and display boards. Charges might apply on private car parks or those operated by other local authorities. Furthermore, please make sure that if you are using the car park before 11am that your Dales parking permit is clearly displayed on your vehicle's dashboard.
