January 2025 Thought

May I begin by saying a very Happy and Blessed New Year to you All. 2024 was a real challenge for many of us. There were changes in our parishes and in our locality. On a national level we have a new Government and we are still waiting to see what the change of philosophy will be and also the unforeseen issues which will come about. In many countries on the global stage fear and 'fake news' seem to have pushed many people to the right of politic and political theory.

Even in our part of the world there are so many people in need. The institutional church has been seen lacking so we come into 2025 with what?

I'd like to suggest the need for three things in our churches:

1. We need to take our 'church life' seriously – working for unity and equality, not some 'them and us' mentality. The church to quote Pope Francis is a Field Hospital, it's there to serve and care for each other. It's about remembering the Church is our Home - a Home for everyone. The Church isn't just there for people who look like me, think like me, or even only believe what I do. Archbishop William Temple said that the 'Church' is an organisation in existence for those who aren't members. So to take church life seriously we have to take the Gift of 'Hospitality' seriously!

2. We need to pray more; we need to spend more time talking to God and listening to God. We all need to remember that praying for us must be as important as breathing. To be fruitful in times of prayer, we need to be Humble, we need to Listen to what God is calling us to do. We all need to remember that faith and a healthy prayer life are gifts from God not our right. We also need to remember that to be a Christian is to be open to give all people a safe healthy place to worship God, and to serve the people of

our communities. So again, to take church life seriously we have to take the Gift of 'Hospitality' seriously!

3. Loving Care. At the Heart of the Christian Church is a Meal (Holy Communion) which goes back to the last supper Jesus had with his disciples. We may celebrate this in different ways but it's all about sharing a Meal, not just with 'special people' but the Meal is really for everyone. In our Churches we state that everyone is welcome to share if they believe in Christ and the basic doctrines of the church, but this itself is a work in progress as we get to know Jesus in a deeper way. We invite people in to church and welcome them but we also go out into our communities and tell them of Jesus and His love for everyone.

In November my dad died. For many years he was bed bound and he had to really dig down deep to do the easiest things. However, even in the pain and sadness of his suffering and death he still had faith that he was a child of God. Our life is worth so very much. All people are so very precious in God's eyes. None of us are perfect but we are not labelled by our mistakes or our sins. God still loves us. So, in 2025, let us not lose Hope in the love of God, lose our sense of humour nor our sense of grace in God.

Again friends – try our churches in 2025. If something's gone wrong in the past, please give us a new chance and teach us how to be more welcoming. On the other side of this idea is our churches are incomplete without you.

Closure of Via Gellia: 6 January to 1 March 2025

Derbyshire County Council (DCC) are commissioning "Tree Felling Works" along the Via Gellia (A5012) between Cromford and Newhaven. The formal notice covers the whole 15km of the route between 8am and 4pm on every one of 55 consecutive days between 6 January and 1 March.

The Parish Council have persuaded DCC that it is not acceptable to close the whole road for the whole period, and we have received an assurance that DCC will

instead produce a schedule of which sections will close when - but DCC had not managed to do so by the copy date for this issue. They suggest that the works are "unlikely" to start on 6 January, but again, there is nothing specific yet.

When DCC do eventually provide a more detailed closure schedule, Parish Council will publish the information on village noticeboards, on social media, and on the village website. The "one.network" website should also carry this information when it is released.

Winster Village Meeting Wednesday November 27th update

The Parish Council called this meeting to inform all Winster residents of a challenge that has been lodged to the Council's 2023-4 Accounts.

The meeting was independently chaired by Geoff Lester and was attended by 104 residents who heard the grounds of the challenge laid out by Mike Hatfield, Chair of Finance and Parish Clerk, Trisha Dale. Council Chair, David Frederickson explained that the PC wanted to be open and transparent with residents about the risk to the village's finances represented by the challenge. The anonymous complainant's concerns, some of which are relatively trivial administrative matters that could easily have been raised with the Clerk, risks costing the village a lot of money because the complaint must be investigated by an auditor whose charges

amount to £355 per hour. The risk is that this could damage the financial position of the Council, taking money that would be better spent on projects of benefit to Winster and could cause a hike in next year's precept.

The meeting voted unanimously that it has confidence in Winster Parish Council. A second motion was unanimous that the complainant is not acting in the interests of the village. A third motion was passed (with no votes against and only one abstention) that the complainant should withdraw the complaint.

Winsters Morris Dancers 2025 and beyond

As always, Winsters Morris has enjoyed a busy dance schedule this year, the highlight of which was Carnival Day. The visit of our French dancing friends La Valcissienne from Onzain in the Loire for 4 days in early May was another high point, and the reception they received at the Bowling Green was amazing.

Our year started with a taster session in January for potentially new members, the result of which was the addition of three new additions to the team. They have lowered the average age of our dancers by a few years. Since we became a mixed side in 2016, we have found that it appeals to couples, and several have joined Winsters Morris, both as musicians and dancers.

The age range of our members is between 30 something and 70 something, with some coming towards the end of their dancing days. There is a strong tradition of Morris Dancing in Winsters, and the recruitment of younger members will ensure that we are able to put out a Morris team on Carnival Day, and continue as Derbyshire's sole surviving traditional dance team.

The benefits of being a member of Winsters Morris include the opportunity to keep fit,

friendship, a great time socially, and to travel to Europe (see below). Each one of us had to learn our dances from scratch, so if you do decide to give it a go, we will be with you all the way. Equally, if you are thinking about joining us as a musician you would be very welcome. You would be joining one of the best bands of folk musicians of any Morris team in the UK.

Our 'dancing out' happens mostly between May and September. In the main we perform in and around Derbyshire, but we have links with many teams across the country, and also with folk dancing groups in France, Germany and Italy, all three of which coincidentally are in areas that produce some excellent wines. We are already planning our programme for next year, which will include a visit to Ungstein in the Pfalz region of Germany, where our hosts will be the Trachten Gruppe Ungstein, a folk dancing team.

Bus Users Case Studies needed

The government's Transport Select Committee is seeking "evidence about the social and economic impact of declining bus services"

Winsters Parish Council would like to make a response: with the 172 bus now every 2 hours 20 minutes against a service that was nearly hourly a few years ago, we would like to show what difference that has made to peoples' lives or businesses. If you can provide us with a real-life example of how the decline has had a serious impact on you, or someone you know, do please get in touch.

The Committee also want to "consider the broader value that well-run bus services can leverage for different communities/." Whilst some users might choke on the "well-run" description, there is still scope here for us to share positive case studies, of where even our current level of service is delivering important value to people. With immense pressures on public funds, it is important that government isn't tempted to think that lightly-used services mean wasted spending.

four "mobile networks", whereas most properties in Main Street are shown on Ofcom's own coverage checker as having no indoor coverage on "any" of the four networks.

Parish Council made a robust response, and BT immediately backed down, saving us from having to grind through the official objection process. BT promise that our payphone is safe.

Consultation on further integration between Derbyshire County Council & Derbyshire Community Health Services

Derbyshire County Council and Derbyshire Community Health Services have approved a proposal to hold a joint public consultation. This will help us understand whether there is support for entering a formal partnership underpinned by combining the budgets for assessment and reablement activities across both organisations. The public consultation starts on 5 December until 16 January 2025. If the proposals are approved - this would enable us to work jointly to deliver a range of assessment and reablement services aimed at helping people remain independently at home for as long as possible.

During a recent public consultation conducted by Derbyshire County Council around its directly provided services for older people, we heard from partners and stakeholders that there could be advantages from more closely aligning our assessment and reablement activities across Derbyshire Community Health Services and Derbyshire County Council adult care. We are already doing this informally using multi-professional assessments, by sharing skills, training and development. A formal partnership with combined budgets would allow us to take this further - this is known as a section 75 agreement.

We want the people of Derbyshire who leave hospital or whose health and care needs change at home, to be supported to regain as much independence as possible in either a community support setting or in their own home and we want them to have a clear, consistent and easy to navigate experience.

We want to understand from the public, those directly affected and stakeholders, what the implications of a formal partnership might be. We will work together openly and collaboratively across Derbyshire Community Health Services and Derbyshire County Council adult care to fully understand if, and how, our assessment and reablement activities could be improved. We are committed to sharing as much information as we can throughout the decision-making process.

Once the public consultation has closed, the feedback received will be carefully analysed. A recommendations paper will be considered by both organisations in early spring.
