# Vicar's Easter Message

Do you believe in coincidence or do you believe in Divine Providence? Someone, I cannot remember who, said – The more I pray then the more I encounter coincidence. I think what he was saying is that the more we are in tune with God through our prayer life, our relationship with him deepens and we see His hand in people and situations and even places.

One example is when I was at seminary and I couldn't afford a text book or something. Suddenly a £10 gift would be posted to me by someone I didn't know. Someone who couldn't know that I was in need of anything. That was years ago but I often remember these gifts, the widows mite in so many cases, such kindness and generosity. Just as vital I remember those people who would drop me a line saying that they were praying for me. There seemed to be a Divine providence of people being guided by the Holy Spirit.

Now, you may think I'm just being pious? But if you look at your own lives have you had times where the Footsteps of Christ seem to be walking with us. When has Christ walked with you in your life? Think, in this post Eastertide; when Christ who suffered and died for us, who knows our humanity and calls us into His Divinity. Providence is being open to God. We hear so much noise and fractious events in our daily lives sometimes we miss the promptings of the Lord.

In Holy Week I had a revival of my understanding of how things are

connected in Christ. We were taking one of my son's to the dentist and we thought we would do the shopping at the same time. I sat in the car and looked up and there was a 10 inch crack in the windscreen!! At first I said more than my prayers but then we got the shopping done and went to a Windscreen repair place. It said to email and me being a technophobe kept making mistakes! We arrived in Chesterfield and the industrial Estate had three offices. I went in one and the lady on reception was great - she called their repairs Dept and they set a date for the repair. Now, she took my email address and said, "Rev Stephen" Are you a priest? Then before I answered she burst out crying! She'd just lost her mum. Her mum died suddenly, and she just wanted to know that things are OK. She told me about her mum and her mum's faith. She said it was providence we came in just when she was on duty and we called there instead of other garages etc. Small events led us to the place where a lady needed a simple prayer and reassurance. God uses every one if they let Him in. He walks with us and he wants what is best for us and for each other. So please if you've not prayed for a while please try. And keep your eyes open for God working in our world and in your life.

In the power of the Holy Spirit amazing things can happen if we just keep our eyes open and fixed on Christ. God bless you and your loved ones. Let's remember to pray for all our young people who are in their examination season.

Derbyshire Swift Conservation is very active throughout Derbyshire and has just received a £215,000 grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund to work on Swift Conservation in the Derbyshire Dales. You can follow their work on the **Derbyshire Swift Conservation website** and if you come across them working in Winster make them welcome and wish them success. ## Revised opening times for Derbyshire County Libraries

From Monday 31 March 2025 all 43 of our council-run libraries will introduce the new opening hours timetable, and although slightly reduced, the revised hours have been tailored to ensure branches are open when most people regularly use them. All council-run libraries (not including 2 community-run libraries in Woodville and Tideswell) will reduce their opening hours by an average of 10%. However, all libraries will be open for a time on Saturdays, with all but the smallest libraries also opening until 6pm once a week. No libraries will be open for less than 16 hours per week. To mitigate the reduced opening hours, reservation charges for



book and talking book requests, where the item is either in print or in stock in Derbyshire libraries, will be removed, as will charges for borrowing talking books.

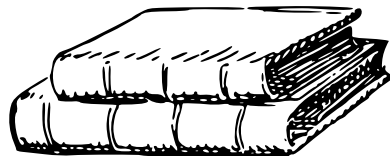

## Ensure you can vote at local elections

Residents in Derbyshire Dales will need to show photographic ID to vote in local elections on 1 May. Residents are being urged to make sure they are ready to vote by checking they have an accepted form of ID.

Accepted forms of ID include a UK, European Economic Area (EEA) or Commonwealth passport or drivers' licence; and some concessionary travel

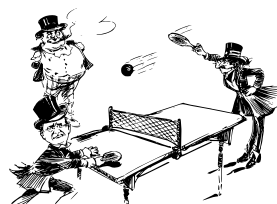
passes, such as an older person's bus pass or an Oyster 60+ card. Voters will be able to use expired ID if they are still recognisable from the photo.

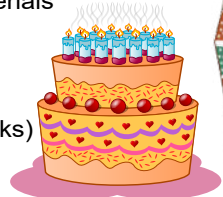
