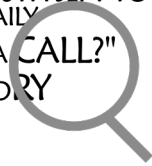

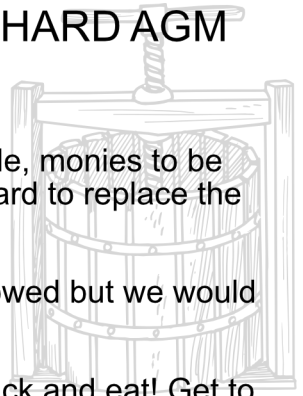

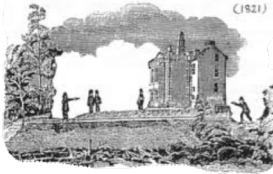

TRY THIS DANCE AND MEET OUR GROUP

Most Tuesday evenings from **October** through to **April**, stand outside the Burton Institute and listen. Young and old are going through the music, steps and figures of the village's own Morris dances. It might also be one of the evenings with a social break included, sharing tea/coffee/cake or a glass of wine.

We are Winster Morris Dancers and you're invited to come and have a go. It's on Tuesdays at 8:00 pm in the Institute and it won't cost you anything.

The first Tuesday taster session is **14th October** at 8:00 pm. Other Tuesdays following are **21st and 28th October**, the **11th, 18th and 25th November** and the **2nd and 9th December**.

Maybe try our one-off daytime workshop on **Saturday 4th October** - have a go at our style of morris. It's at 1.00 pm at the Whitworth Institute, Darley Dale.

Winster-style dances have been handed down since the nineteenth century, and written down in 1908. Dance performance and practice are with live music with musicians who are the envy of other dance groups. There are sometimes opportunities to play at ceilidhs or play for other dancers. Traditional acoustic instruments like concertinas, fiddles, melodeons and recorders are used.

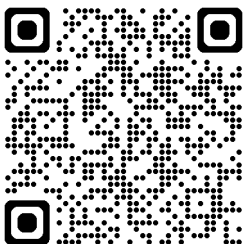

DON'T BUY YOUR TICKET ON THE TRAIN

East Midlands Railway have changed the rules for travel on trains from Matlock. In the past you could expect to buy a ticket on the train, but now (unless the ticket machine is out of action), you have to buy a ticket before you get on the train. If you don't, you face a **£100 penalty on top of the cost of a top-of-the-range single ticket.**

Matlock has a ticket machine where you can buy tickets for cash or card, or collect tickets bought online. Allow plenty of time ahead of your train, in case there is a queue.

The best option is to buy an "e-ticket" online - the ticket comes as a PDF file that you can show on your phone, or print out at home. And you can send a copy to a travelling companion as added backup.



You don't have to buy East Midlands tickets from East Midlands Railway - there are lots of companies selling rail tickets, and prices should be the same, whoever you use.

If you are buying an Advance (fixed train) ticket, use one of the online services but I recommend **railsmartr.co.uk** - they offer the option of re-booking onto a different train without any fees if your plans change. QR code shown here

Rules are strict: you have to buy a new ticket for exactly the same route, before the original departure time, and they will refund the original. Whilst there are no fees for the change, you will have to pay the difference if the new ticket is more expensive than the first (and you don't get any reduction if the new ticket is cheaper). But it is still a useful protection at no extra cost.

GIGACLEAR: NEARLY THERE?

Gigaclear look close to offering us "Full Fibre" broadband at last. And BT have recently announced that they are planning to upgrade their Winstar network to "Full Fibre" too - at some unspecified date. But as the whole country will eventually move over to fibre, this is hardly news. It feels more like a "spoiler" to try and discourage people from signing up to Gigaclear.

There are pros and cons of moving to Gigaclear:

- Much faster broadband than we currently get via copper wires from Openreach
- Very attractive initial offers - from 300Mbps at £19 per month for the first 18 months

·But a big cost jump at 18 months - current renewal is £46 per month upwards. If you don't manage to negotiate them down to an acceptable charge, you face hassle (and perhaps a £50 connection charge) to reconnect via Openreach.

You may be in trouble if you need to call 999 (or anyone else) during a power cut, because any Fibre connection will stop working without electricity at your end. Mobile phones can be an answer (if you have a reliable signal, and provided that the transmitter mast hasn't lost power too). Otherwise you need a Battery Backup Unit, which can cost about £80. Ofcom says anyone without an adequate mobile signal should be given a free unit, and BT honour this. But Gigaclear appear less generous.

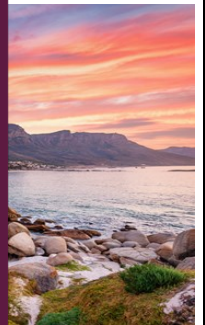
