The Charity invites applications for financial assistance from persons or organisations in need within the Parishes of Winster and South Darley* who meet one of the Charity objectives set out in 1 to 3 below.

The objects of the charity allow for the income (after paying all costs inclusive of repairs, insurance, administration and management of the charity) to be applied in:

1. Relieving either generally or individually persons resident in the parish of Winster/South Darley who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress by making grants of money or providing or paying for items, services, or facilities calculated to reduce the need, hardship or distress of such persons.

2. Paying for such items, services or facilities by way of donations or subscriptions to institutions or organisations which provide or which undertake in return to provide such items, services or facilities for such persons.
3. In exceptional cases the Trustees may grant relief to persons otherwise eligible therefor who are resident immediately outside the parish of Winster/South Darley but in the opinion of the Trustees ought nevertheless for sufficient reason to be treated as if resident therein or who are located for the time being within that parish.

New Peak of Achievement for Winster's Jonathan Francis

The magnificent 'Northern Requiem', written to commemorate the Miners' Strike of 1984/5 and previously staged in Chesterfield and Sheffield, was recently given its third and final performance in Durham Cathedral.

It was composed and conducted by Jonathan Francis, who was born and brought up in Winster and whose dad still lives here. Jonathan now lives in Chesterfield, where he is founder and director of the Rose Hill Arts Centre.

The Requiem featured a collaboration of choral singing, solo singers and instrumentalists, a brass band, parades of banners, and many impassioned contributions by men and women of the local mining community. It was a moving and memorable performance and tears were shed.

A group from Winster went to Durham to see it. They took with them a silver cup that had originated with the Winster Harmonic Society in 1931 but been re-purposed for other musical highlights at later dates. Inscribed on

the base of the cup was '1998 Jonathan Francis', marking the time when the 17-year-old had been judged the best act in Carnival's 'Winster Night'. On that occasion he showed his remarkable talent by singing and playing the intricate comic songs of Victoria Wood.

The cup, which had gone the rounds in the intervening years, was informally re-presented to Jonathan following the Durham Cathedral performance to mark this new peak in his distinguished career. Jonathan was suitably touched.

Auntie Amy's Life In Winster



Taya Ashin (age 13) interviewed Amy Slater ('Aunty Amy', age 95).

I interviewed Auntie Amy about her life in Winster and the wonderful, interesting experiences she had with her life here and the games she used to play as a child. I have written here just a small chunk of her fascinating life.

Family. Auntie Amy was born on June 19th 1930, but she wasn't born in Winster, she was born in Youlgrave. She moved to Gratton Moor Farm and had to walk 3 miles from there just to get to school in Middleton. She was about 8 when the family came to Winster to live in Stoop Farm, now called The Angel.

Jobs and hobbies and other interesting facts. When Auntie Amy moved to Winster she joined the youth club and did Morris dancing, among other things. When she turned 18 she became a Christian and that has been important throughout her life. She told me something interesting that when she came to Winster it was her first time ever experiencing cooking and lighting with gas. She also told me how Winster looked when she moved in. It was different from what it is now. On Main Street a lot of the houses were not just houses they were shops. She remembers that a lot of them were butchers and one of them had a fridge, which was quite unusual for its times, as there were very few fridges.

During World War 2. Auntie Amy remembers there being safety drills. Also they would put some blackout behind the windows in case they broke. The shards of glass stuck to it, so it did not shatter, which I think is quite intriguing. She also told me something wonderful and romantic, that she was married at 20 to Dennis and she and her husband had one son together. That is Gordon (Sam) who now lives next door to Amy. Soon after she came to Winster it was the beginning of World War 2. The soldiers who were in the village at that time used to eat their food in the

Hall and some of them stayed above the Bowling Green. She told me how the soldiers used to play football in their free time and use the Market House as a goal post, opening up the doors and kicking the ball in there. She remembers that once one of the soldiers kicked the ball straight through the window of the house Auntie Amy now lives in, and the lady who lived there was furious.

Games and all sorts of mischief. Auntie Amy said that she and her family lived in a house with a sort of cellar or basement underneath. At one point everyone who had a cellar could smell a smell like petrol and oil. No one knew where it was coming from, but one day they found out that Mr Gregory's oil was spilling out underground and could have blown up Winster. Luckily they found the leak before it was too late. She told me all about the games they used to play. It was girls versus boys. One group at the Market House counted to 100 and the other group ran off. They used to say 'shout else we shan't follow', which to me sounds a pretty good game, to be honest. She and her friends also used to play 'Truth or Dare', which seems absolutely iconic!

Auntie Amy told me lots about her very unique interesting life. I really enjoyed talking to her. Even though I can't fit everything in here, I hope you can get the same laughs and enjoyment out of reading just a little bit of her story as I did.

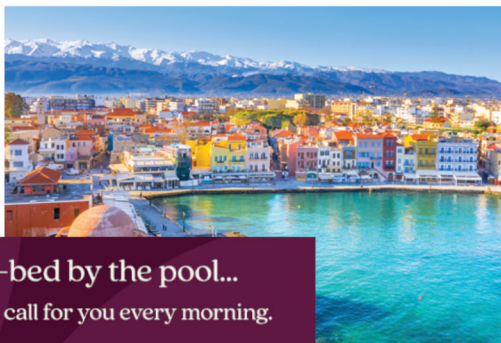
